One case that was reported in Van Zandt County was actually a Rains County resident reported on June 18, 2020. Due to this fact, we had reported 53 cases; however our number on June 18, 2020 should have reflected 52 cases.

NET Health has confirmed the second and third deaths in Van Zandt County related to COVID-19.
