On this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1948, the City Council of the City of Canton met in regular session at its regular meeting place in the City Hall in the City of Canton, with J. W. Terry, the Mayor, and the following Aldermen present: L. F. Sanders, T. R. Keahey, Harvey Fincher, G. P. Scott and A. D. Davis, and with Angus Travis acting as the City Secretary.

Among other business came on to be discussed the advisability of granting to F. A. Wade an easement over that part of the city streets in the town of Canton lying North of the North Line of Block no. 42 in the Original Townsite and the South Line of State Highway No. 64, and the proposal of F. A. Wade to pave that part of such streets in order that he might have a paved entrance and right of way of ingress and egress from the State Highway into the buildings to be erected upon his properties.

There was discussed the benefits to be derived from the paving of such properties not only to the residents of the City of Canton but to the traveling public. Upon being submitted to a vote it was determined that the City of Canton should grant to F. A. Wade the easement and right of way perpetually to use such properties in consideration of the sum of \$10.00 and the benefits to be derived by the paving of such properties, and further that all rules relative to the passage of any ordinance should be suspended.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED that the City of Canton grant to F. A. Wade the easement to use and maintain a right of way of ingress and egress perpetually over that part of the streets lying between the North Line of Block No. 42 and the South Line of Highway 64, and the Mayor and the City Secretary

be authorized and hereby directed to execute and deliver to F. A. Wade the easement in accordance herewith, a copy of which easement is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

There being no further business before the meeting, the same was in all things adjourned.

Sanders authorizing the Mayor to accept the bid of Reynolds and Huff on street project, without requiring them to make bond, with the understanding that a trade be made with Reynolds and Huff to deduct a portion of the cost of the bond from their bid. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Glenn Scott and seconded by Harvey Fincher authorizing the sale of 1/2 the royalty under the City Lake property, excepting under the 10 acres where 1/2 was reserved in deed from J. W. Bateman at the time it was purchased by the City, at a price of \$50.00 per acre for a term of 20 years. Motion carried.

Motion was made by A. D. Davis and seconded by L. F. Sanders to set the City tax rate at \$1.50 per \$100.00 valuation. \$.80 rate for General Sinking Fund and \$.70 for nightwatchman and general tax purposes.

Motion was made by T. R. Keahey and seconded by L. F. Sanders authorizing the Mayor to pay J. T. Beard \$28.00 for water pipe paid for by J. T. Beard used for service line between the city water mains and the water meter at one of his tenant houses. Motion carried.

Motion was made by T. R. Keahey and seconded by Harvey Fincher authorizing Mrs. W.H. Morrison to collect <sup>the</sup> City Tax for the year 1948. Motion carried.
