WHEREAS, on the 30th day of April, 1957, the City Council of the City of Canton, Texas, convened with the following members present, to-wit:

at which time came on to be considered the following:

Payment by City of Canton, Texas, to J.L. Meyers' Sons, Dallas, Texas, for the following equipment and services:

One (1) water well drilled and equipped with pump, casing, pipe and fittings necessary for immediate operation, for the total price of \$17,824.00.

WHERE UPON Motion was made by J. H. Reynolds and seconded by B. R. Mahaffey that the City of Canton, Texas, pay for said above described services and equipment for the persons above named, and that the City Mayor and the City Secretary be authorized to borrow necessary funds from the First National Bank, Canton, Texas, for payment of said services and equipment and execute such evidence of indebtedness as may be necessary to bind and obligate the City of Canton, Texas, for payment of such indebtedness and for such period of time as they may deem necessary, at an interest rate not to exceed four (4%) per cent, per annum, which motion carried. Said order now appearing of record in the Minutes of the City of Canton, Texas, a certified copy of which is attached hereto and made a part thereof: and

WHEREAS, said above described services and equipment is to be purchased for the use and benefit of the City of Canton, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Canton, Texas has insufficient funds to take care of said purchase; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to order above described and by authority thereof, the City of Canton, Texas, acting by and through W. L. Staton, Mayor, and W. A. Blankinship, City Secretary, and First National Bank, Canton, Texas, has this 30th day of April, 1957 entered into the following agreement:

First National Bank of Canton, Texas has agreed to loan City of Canton, Texas, the sum of \$10,000.00 at the rate of four (4%) per cent per annum. Both principal and interest in the amount of \$10,422.00 to be paid to First National Bank, Canton, Texas, in twenty-four (24) equal monthly installments of \$434.25 each; the first installment becoming due on or before the 1st day of June, 1957, and one installment due on or before the 1st day of each succeeding month thereafter until the whole principal sum together with interest thereon is paid; and it being further agreed that above said \$10,000.00 is to be deposited to the Water and Sewer Interest and Bond Fund of City of Canton, Texas.

Motion was made by B. R. Mahaffey that any fireman will be billed for water at the regular rate per thousand over the first 6,000 gallons free beginning June 1st. Motion was seconded by C. T. Coleman. Motion carried Unanimously.

Then came on the discussion of lower water rates for the summer and a motion was made by J. H. Reynolds that beginning with the July 15th reading through the October 15th reading the following reduced water rates for domestic users only will be: 1000 for \$2.00 next 4,000 gallons be 40¢ per thousand, the next 5,000 cost 30¢ per thousand gallons and all over this amount be 25¢ per thousand. Motion was seconded by B. R. Mahaffey. Motion carried unanimously.

After discussion of other city matters where no action was taken a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
