ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

THE STATE OF TEXAS :
COUNTY OF VAN ZANDT :
CITY OF CANTON :

WHEREAS, the bonds hereinafter authorized were lawfully and favorably voted at an election duly held in said City on August 12, 1969; and

WHEREAS, none of the bonds voted at said election has been authorized, issued, or delivered; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and advisable to authorize, issue, and deliver an installment or series of said bonds; and

WHEREAS, the bonds hereinafter authorized and designated were voted and are to be issued and delivered pursuant to Vernon's Article 823;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the said City's bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$200,000 for the purpose of improving and extending the City's Waterworks System.

Section 2. That said bonds shall be designated as the: City of Canton General Obligation Bonds, Series 1971.

Section 3. That said bonds shall be dated January 1, 1971. shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 each, shall be numbered consecutively from one upward, and shall mature serially on the maturity date, in each of the years, and in the amounts, respectively, as set forth in the following schedule:

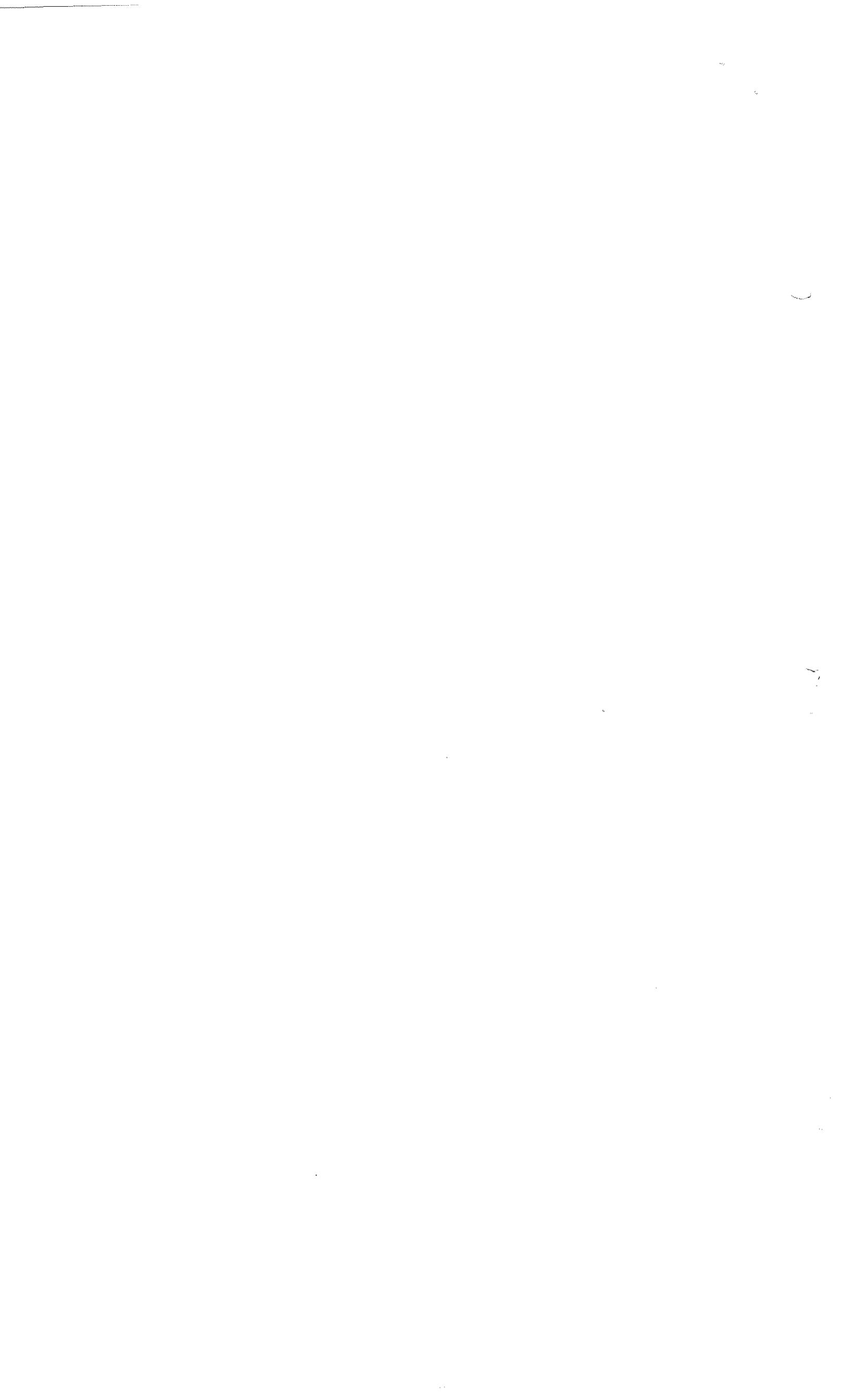

By the date fixed for any such redemption due provision shall be made with the "Paying Agent" for the payment of the principal amount of the bonds which are to be so redeemed and accrued interest thereon to the date fixed for redemption. If such written notice of redemption is published and if due provision for such payment is made, all as provided above, the bonds which are to be so redeemed thereby automatically shall be redeemed prior to their scheduled maturities, and they shall not bear interest after the date fixed for redemption, and they shall not be regarded as being outstanding except for the right of the bearer to receive the redemption price from the "Paying Agent" out of the funds provided for such payment.

IT IS HEREBY certified, recited, and covenanted that this bond has been duly and validly voted, authorized, issued, and delivered; that all acts, conditions, and things required or proper to be performed, exist, and be done precedent to or in the voting, authorization, issuance, and delivery of this bond have been performed, existed, and been done in accordance with law; that this bond is a general obligation of said City, issued on the full faith and credit thereof; and that annual ad valorem taxes sufficient to provide for the payment of the interest on and principal of this bond, as such interest comes due and such principal matures, have been levied and ordered to be levied against all taxable property in said City, and have been pledged irrevocably for such payment, within the limit prescribed by law.

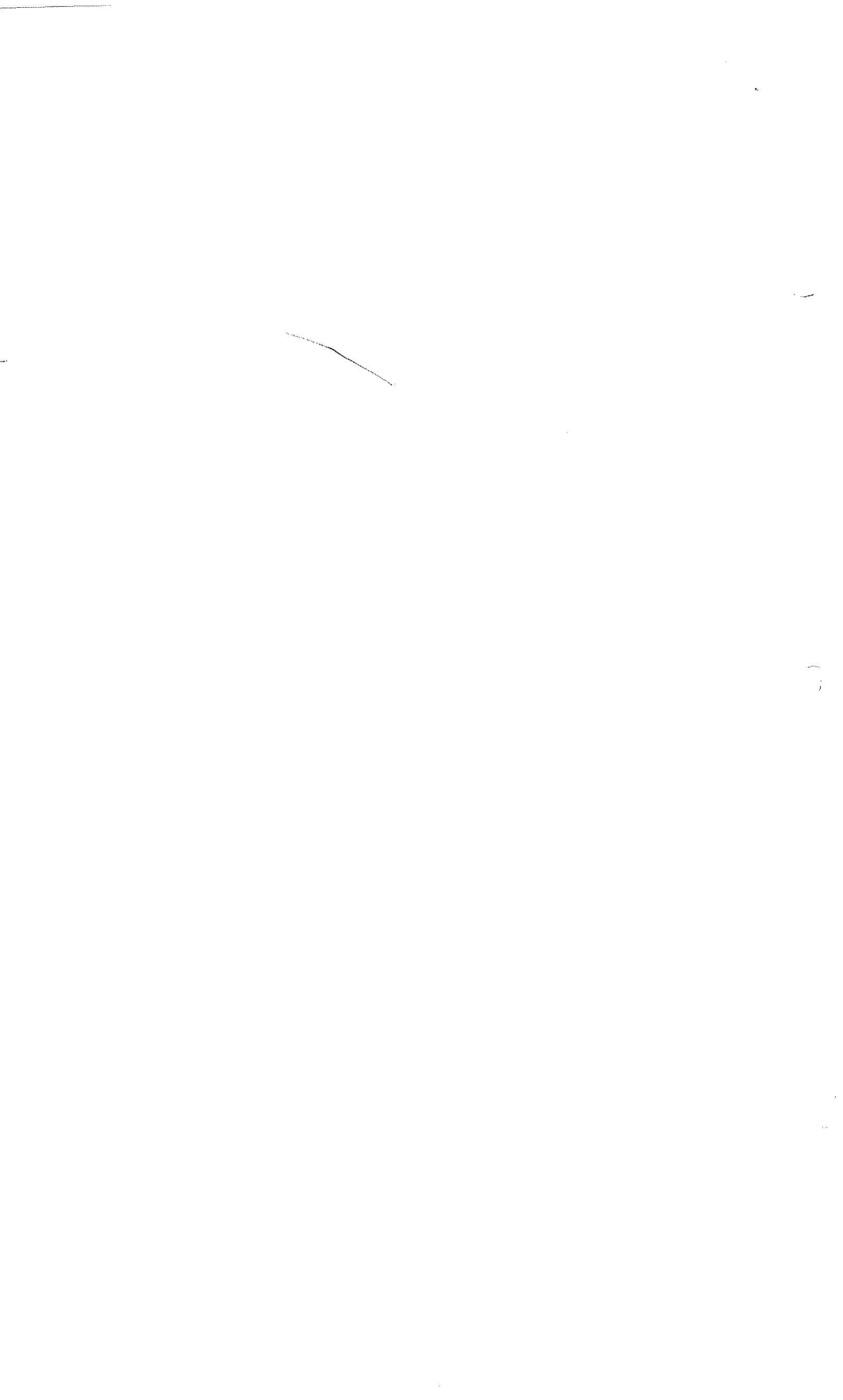

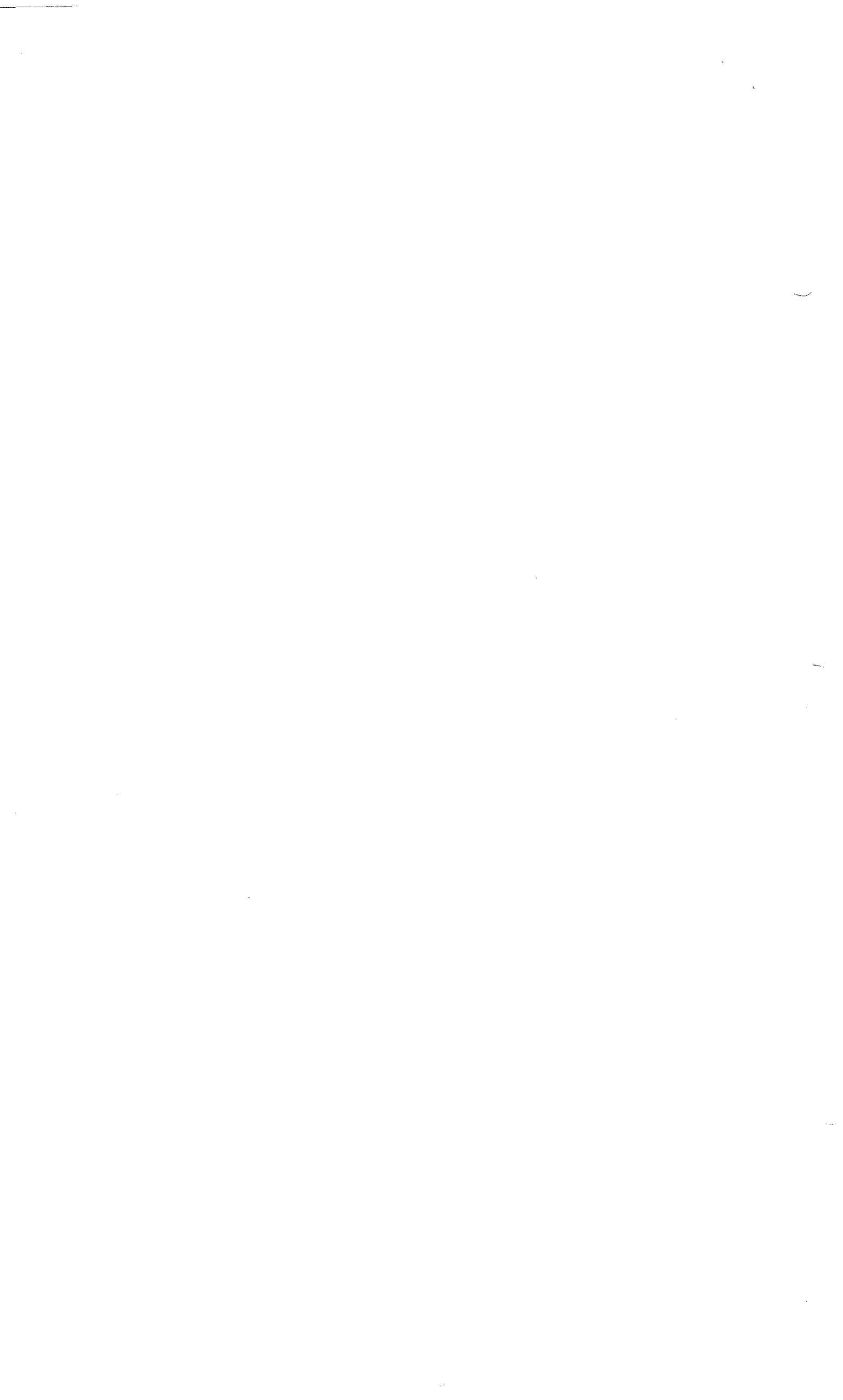

Section 7. That a special "Interest and Sinking Fund" is hereby created solely for the benefit of said bonds, and said Interest and Sinking Fund shall be established and maintained by said City at an official depository bank of said City. Said Interest and Sinking Fund shall be kept separate and apart from all other funds and accounts of said City, and shall be used only for paying the interest on and principal of said bonds. All ad valorem taxes levied and collected for and on account of said bonds shall be deposited, as collected, to the credit of said Interest and Sinking Fund. During each year while any of said bonds or interest coupons appertaining thereto are outstanding and unpaid, the governing body of said City shall compute and ascertain a rate and amount of ad valorem tax which will be sufficient to raise and produce the money required to pay the interest on said bonds as such interest comes due, and to provide and maintain a sinking fund adequate to pay the principal of such bonds as such principal matures (but never less than 2% of the original principal amount of said bonds as a sinking fund each year); and said tax shall be based on the latest approved tax rolls of said City, with full allowance being made for tax delinquencies and the cost of tax collection. Said rate and amount of ad valorem tax is hereby levied, and is hereby ordered to be levied, against all taxable property in said City for each year while any of said bonds or interest coupons appertaining thereto are outstanding and unpaid; and said tax shall be assessed and collected each such year and deposited to the credit of the aforesaid Interest and Sinking Fund. Said ad valorem taxes sufficient to provide for the payment of the interest on and principal of said bonds, as such interest comes due and such principal matures, are hereby pledged irrevocably for such payment, within the limit prescribed by law.

Section 8. That the Mayor of said City is hereby authorized to have control of said bonds and all necessary records and proceedings pertaining to said bonds pending their delivery and their investigation, examination, and approval by the Attorney General of the State of Texas, and their registration by the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas. Upon

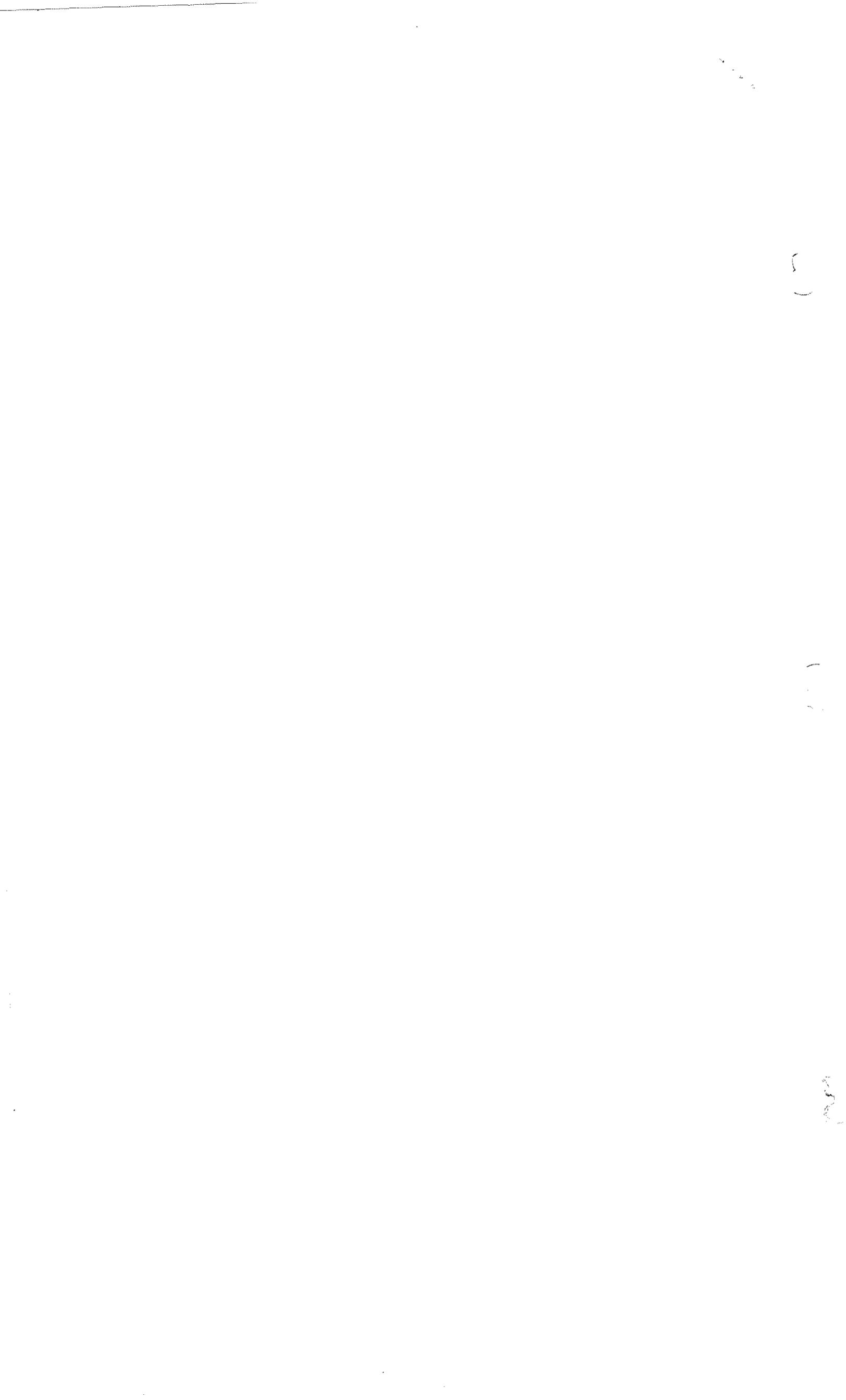


registration of said bonds, said Comptroller of Public Accounts (or a deputy designated in writing to act for said Comptroller) shall manually sign the Comptroller's Registration Certificate printed and endorsed on each of said bonds, and the seal of said Comptroller shall be impressed, or placed in facsimile, on each of said Bonds.

Section 9. That said City hereby covenants that the proceeds from the sale of said bonds will be used as soon as practicable for the purpose for which said bonds are issued; that such proceeds will not be invested in any securities or obligations except for the temporary period pending such use; and that such proceeds will not be used directly or indirectly so as to cause all or any part of said bonds to be or become "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 103(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or any regulations or rulings prescribed or made pursuant thereto.

Section 10. That it is hereby officially found and determined: that a case of emergency or urgent public necessity exists which requires the holding of the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed, such emergency or urgent public necessity being that the proceeds from the sale of said bonds are required as soon as possible and without delay for necessary and urgently needed public improvements; and that said meeting was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by Vernon's Ann. Civ. St. Article 6252-17.

Section 11. That said bonds are hereby sold and shall be delivered to Rauscher Pierce Securities Corporation for cash for the par value thereof and accrued interest thereon to date of delivery, plus a premium of \$ -0-.

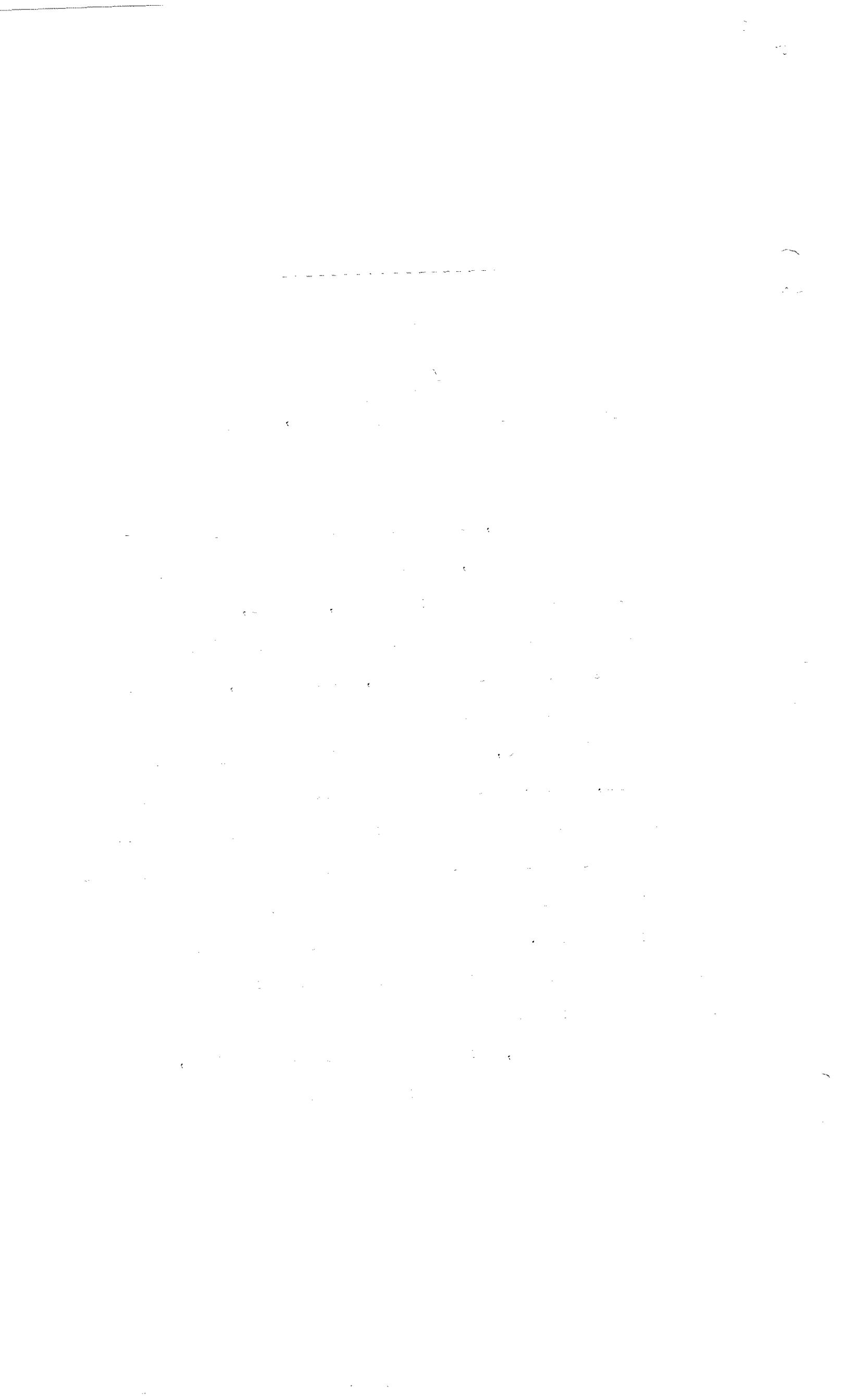

WHEREAS, by reason of grave public necessity and the health, welfare and recreation of the citizenship of the City of Canton, Texas, the City has heretofore ratified and confirmed two bond issues for the purpose of securing lands, easements, right of ways and other property; and

WHEREAS, said City of Canton has employed engineers, has secured a permit from the State of Texas and has secured a ratification and approval from the United States Government whereby the United States Government has agreed to participate by joining the City of Canton in paying certain parts and portions of the expenses attached to and a part of a lake site for the City of Canton; and

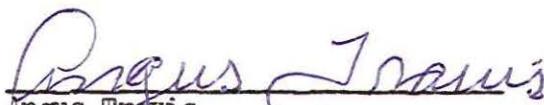

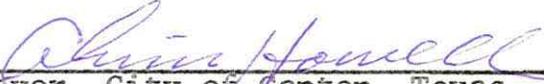
