The Canton City Council met in their regular scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Dennis Mann (late), Russell Eubank, Sam Hilliard and Herman Heard.

The minutes from the previous meeting were read. Sam Hilliard suggested that the residents on Dodson Street be contacted regarding the installation of curbs and gutters on the street. Gerald Turner is to contact the residents explaining the cost to them for the curbs and gutters if they are interested in same. Gerald Turner is to report back at the next meeting as to the results of these inquiries.

The subject of advertising for First Monday was discussed. Sam Hilliard made the motion that Herman Heard and Mayor Lewis be authorized to advertise again for the month of February. Herman Heard seconded the motion. All in favor.

It was advised that the hearing on the General Telephone law suit has been set for January 24, 1975, in the District Court of Van Zandt County, Texas. Gerald Turner is to contact Bob Bartlett concerning same and see if there is anything the City needs to do prior to the hearing.

Gerald Turner was advised to contact all previous Mayors and Councilmen to extend an invitation to them for the ground breaking ceremony for the Mill Creek Lake Project.

The building permits were discussed. Sam Hilliard made the motion that the building permit code be put in Ordinance form. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Sam Hilliard made the motion that the minutes be approved as read. Herman Heard seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mr. S. C. Broyles came before the Council requesting road repairs on the corner of Desert Willow and Oak Street. It was also brought to the attention of the Council that repairs need to be made along 1780 Cypress Street. Gerald Turner is to see that this matter is taken care of.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. gave the Fire Department and Police Reports.

Russell Eubank gave a report on the office and vehicles. Mr. Eubank suggested that a duplicate check system be adopted for use in the office. He

felt this would eliminate any errors in stubbing the checks and he felt this would give a more precise account of checks written. Herman Heard made the motion that Russell Eubank be given authorization to set up the duplicate check system for the office, at whatever expense Mr. Eubank thought feasible. Sam Hilliard seconded the motion. All in favor.

Sam Hilliard gave a report on the Water & Sewer Department, the dump grounds and the Hillcrest Cemetery. Mr. Hilliard suggested that the prices of hauling trash to the dump grounds be set out as follows:

Pick-up load of refuse	-	\$ 5.00
Truck load of refuse	-	20.00
Normal loads	-	1.00

This matter to be considered and discussed at the next meeting.

Herman Heard gave the First Monday Report.

Next on the agenda was a request from David Norman for a reserved parking space in front of his business for customers needing prescriptions filled. After some discussion, Sam Hilliard made the motion that Mr. Norman be given one parking space in front of his business for customers needing prescriptions. Mr. Norman may put up a sign with whatever wording necessary to reserve this space for this purpose. Herman Heard seconded the motion. All in favor. Mayor Lewis recommended that this be tried for 60 days before made permanent. Also, Billy Jack Peace, Jr. is to contact Chief Williams regarding enforcement of the 2 hour parking ordinance.

Call of election was next on the agenda. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion to call the election for the first Saturday in April, 1975. Herman Heard seconded the motion. All in favor.

The Financial Report was discussed. Gerald Turner was advised to check with Mr. Hal Hood, Fire Marshall, regarding the Fireman's Pension Fund. The Financial Report was approved as given.

The list of surplus equipment belonging to the City was discussed. Sam Hilliard made the motion that the 1959 truck be put up for bids immediately. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. Mayor Lewis recommended that Mr. Eubank, Mr. Hilliard and Gerald Turner look over the equipment and report back to the next Council meeting as to what to do with the surplus equipment.

A request for a street light on Avenue C was discussed. Sam Hilliard made the motion, seconded by Herman Heard, that Dennis Mann contact T P & L and have

The Canton City Council met in a regular scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Dennis Mann, Sam Hilliard and Russell Eubank. Herman Heard was absent.

Mayor Lewis read the minutes from the previous meetings. The curb and gutter proposal for Dodson Street was discussed. Gerald Turner stated that he had contacted six of the residents and all but one was in favor of the curbs and gutters. Sam Hilliard recommended that Gerald Turner contact all the residents further and see how many would definitely be in favor of the curbs and gutters at the price of approximately \$3.25 per running foot. Mr. Hilliard also suggested that if the majority of the residents are in favor of the curbs and gutters, that an Ordinance be drawn up making the curbs and gutters mandatory, thereby relinquishing the problem of opposition by a minority of the residents.

Sam Hilliard made the motion that the minutes be approved as read. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mr. S. C. Broyles came before the Council requesting street repairs on Desert Willow. Dennis Mann reported that the City had a boxcar load of pre-mix in Edgewood ready to be unloaded and that as soon as the weather permits that the City employees will start on the street repairs.

The Financial Statement was presented. Dennis Mann made the motion, seconded by Billy Jack Peace, Jr., that the Financial Statement be approved. All in favor.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. gave the Police Department and the Fire Department reports. Fire Chief Tawater stated the number and types of fires for the month of January.

Dennis Mann gave the Public Relations and Street reports.

Russell Eubank gave the Office and Vehicles reports.

Sam Hilliard gave a report on the dump grounds, Hillcrest Cemetery and the Water & Sewer Department. Mr. Hilliard suggested that the City look into the possibility of having Truett Laboratories in Dallas check the water specimens each month instead of Johnson Laboratories in Tyler, who is presently checking the specimens. Johnson Laboratories charges \$72.00 per month, compared to Truett Laboratories' rate of \$24.00 per month. Dennis Mann made the motion, seconded by

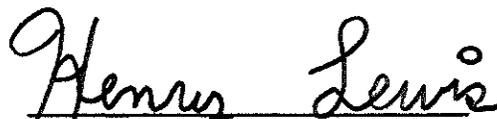

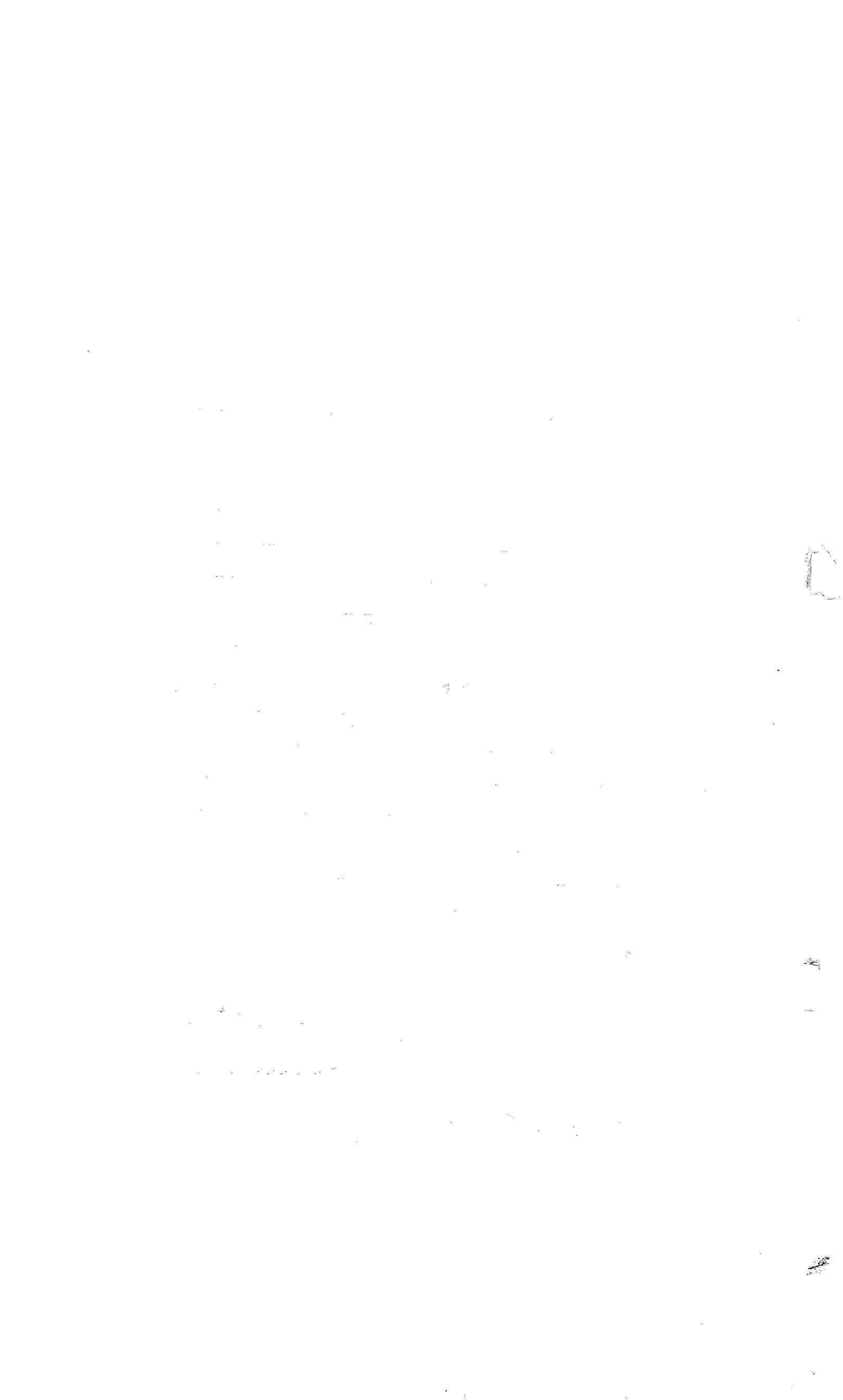

Billy Jack Peace, Jr., that Sam Hilliard be given the authority to compare the two and decide which laboratory should be used.

Gerald Turner gave the First Monday report due to the absence of Herman Heard.

A request for a street light on Forrest Drive and one in the 900 block of Hwy 243 was next on the agenda. Sam Hilliard made the motion, seconded by Billy Jack Peace, Jr. that Dennis Mann and Gerald Turner be authorized to contact T P & L to make a survey to see if a street is needed in these two areas. All in favor. Sam Hilliard suggested that the night policeman make a survey once a week, checking the street lights around town to see how many are burning and how many need replacing. If the street lights that are reported out are not replaced in sufficient time, that the City deduct \$3.45 per light (the charge to the City per street light) from the light bill each month.

A request for a waterline extension on Hwy 64 West was brought before the Council. Sam Hilliard recommended that the owners of the land who originally paid for the waterline extension be contacted to see how many are presently using the line. If there are under 10 residents on the line, the individual needing the extension should rebate the owners for their part of the money put up for the original waterline. Dennis Mann made the motion that Mr. Hilliard's recommendation be adopted, seconded by Billy Jack Peace, Jr. All in favor.

A request for a "No Parking" sign by Newman's Cleaners on Athens Street was brought before the Council. It was recommended that a "No Parking Here to Corner" sign be put up in order to prevent traffic problems at this site and that the City Secretary make a survey to see if this solves the problem.

Bids on the 1959 Chevrolet dump truck were presented to the Council. Red Hill Wrecking bid \$162.50 and Mr. F. D. Barton bid \$155.00. Dennis Mann made the motion that the bid from Red Hill Wrecking be accepted and Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

The rates at the dump grounds was discussed. Sam Hilliard suggested that the following rated be adopted:

Pick-up loads of refuse	\$5.00
Normal loads of refuse	1.00
Truck loads of refuse	20.00

Dennis Mann made the motion that these rates be adopted and tried for 60 days and the results reported back to the Council. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Gerald Turner presented literature and information regarding a new copy machine for the office. The machine now in use is a Xerox, which the City is leasing for \$60.00 per month. The new machine is made by Pitney-Bowles and can be purchased rather than leased. Sam Hilliard made the motion that Russell Eubank and Gerald Turner be given authorization to purchase the copy machine and pay for same in the way they thought feasible. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All in favor.

Dennis Mann made the motion that a curfew Ordinance be drawn up restricting any student enrolled in a public school from being out past 7:00 P.M. and before 5:00 A.M. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor. The curfew Ordinance to be made a part of the minutes herein.

No other business at hand, meeting adjourned.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANTON, TEXAS:

A.

IT SHALL HEREAFTER BE UNLAWFUL WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF CANTON, TEXAS FOR ANY STUDENT ENROLLED IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL TO BE IN OR AROUND OR ON ANY PUBLIC PLACE OR BE ON A PUBLIC STREET WITHIN THE CORPORATE CITY LIMITS OF CANTON, TEXAS AFTER THE HOUR OF 11:00 P.M. AND THROUGH THE HOUR OF 5:00 A.M. EACH DAY OF THE WEEK. A STUDENT WILL NOT BE IN VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IF SAID STUDENT IS GOING DIRECTLY TO OR FROM PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT OR RETURNING FROM OUTSIDE CANTON, TEXAS CITY LIMITS AND GOING DIRECTLY TO A RESIDENCE.

B.

IT SHALL HEREAFTER BE UNLAWFUL WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF CANTON, TEXAS FOR ANYONE TO LOITER IN OR AROUND OR ON A PUBLIC PLACE OR ON A PUBLIC STREET AS A PEDESTRIAN, MOTORIST, OR A PASSENGER IN A MOTOR VEHICLE PARKED OR MOVING AT ANY TIME.

C.

NO PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN SHALL KNOWINGLY PERMIT ANY PERSON IN HIS CUSTODY TO VIOLATE SECTIONS "A AND B" HEREOF.

D.

IF ANY PERSON IS IN VIOLATION OF SECTIONS "A AND B" HEREOF, IT SHALL BE PRESUMED HIS PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN KNOWINGLY PERMITTED THE SAME. THIS IS A PRESUMPTION WHICH MAY BE REBUTTED BY THE DEFENDANT BY LEGALLY COMPETENT EVIDENCE.

E.

ANY VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PUNISHED BY A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$200.00.

F.

SHOULD AN EVENT BE FORTHCOMING THAT A VARIANCE OF THIS ORDINANCE BE THOUGHT JUSTIFIED, A WRITTEN REQUEST MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE MAYOR'S OFFICE FOR CITY COUNCIL CONSIDERATION FIVE DAYS PRIOR TO EVENT.

G.

SUCH PERSON SHALL NOT BE CONSIDERED GUILTY OF VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IF HE OR SHE IS ACCOMPANIED BY HIS OR HER PARENT, SPOUSE, OR LEGAL GUARDIAN.

H.

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE FROM FEBRUARY 22, 1975.

The Canton City Council met in a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Dennis Man, Russell Eubank, Sam Hilliard and Herman Heard.

Minutes from the previous meetings were read. The curb and gutter proposal for Dodson Street was discussed. The City Secretary reported that all but four of the twenty-three residents were in favor of the curbs and gutters, and that a majority of these desired that financing be made available. Sam Hilliard suggested that a form letter be sent to each of the residents explaining that the City is not in a position at the present time to finance this amount of money, but that the City would look into the possibility of financing the curbs and gutters at a later date.

Sam Hilliard asked that a correction to the minutes of February 11, 1975, be made regarding the prices for dump permits. Mr. Hilliard asked that the prices set in the February 11, 1975 meeting for dump permits be applied only to non-residents and that the prices for permits to residents of the City of Canton apply

as previously set. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion that Mr. Hilliard's correction be adopted. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All in favor.

Russell Eubank made the motion, seconded by Dennis Mann, that the minutes be approved as read. All in favor.

The Financial Statement was discussed. Dennis Mann made the motion, seconded by Russell Eubank, that the Financial Statement be approved as given. All in favor.

The E. B. Jones lease was next on the agenda. After some discussion, Sam Hilliard made the motion that the lease be left as is and that Mr. Jones be allowed to use the property in question as long as he desires, unless problems arise in the future. Motion seconded by Russell Eubank. All in favor.

A street light request on Oak Square was discussed. Sam Hilliard made the motion that Gerald Turner and Dennis Mann be given authorization to contact TP&L about putting a street light in that area and that any future street light requests be handled by the City Secretary and Dennis Mann, unless some problem arises that needs to be brought before the Council for a decision. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All in favor.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. gave the Police and Fire Department reports. Mr. Peace suggested that a "No Parking on Pavement" sign be erected on S. Highway 19 at the city limits to prevent First Monday traffic from parking on the highway and blocking traffic in that area. Herman Heard made the motion that Hoss Williams and Billy Jack Peace, Jr. be authorized to erect a sign to that effect on Hwy. 19. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. also suggested that a sign be erected on W. Elm Street by the school, from Buffalo Street to Athens Street, stating that the street be made one-way from 2:30 P.M. until 4:00 P.M. from Monday through Friday. Dennis Mann made the motion, seconded by Herman Heard, that Billy Jack Peace, Jr. and Hoss Williams be authorized to handle this matter.

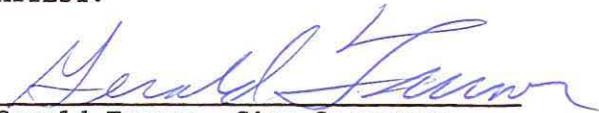

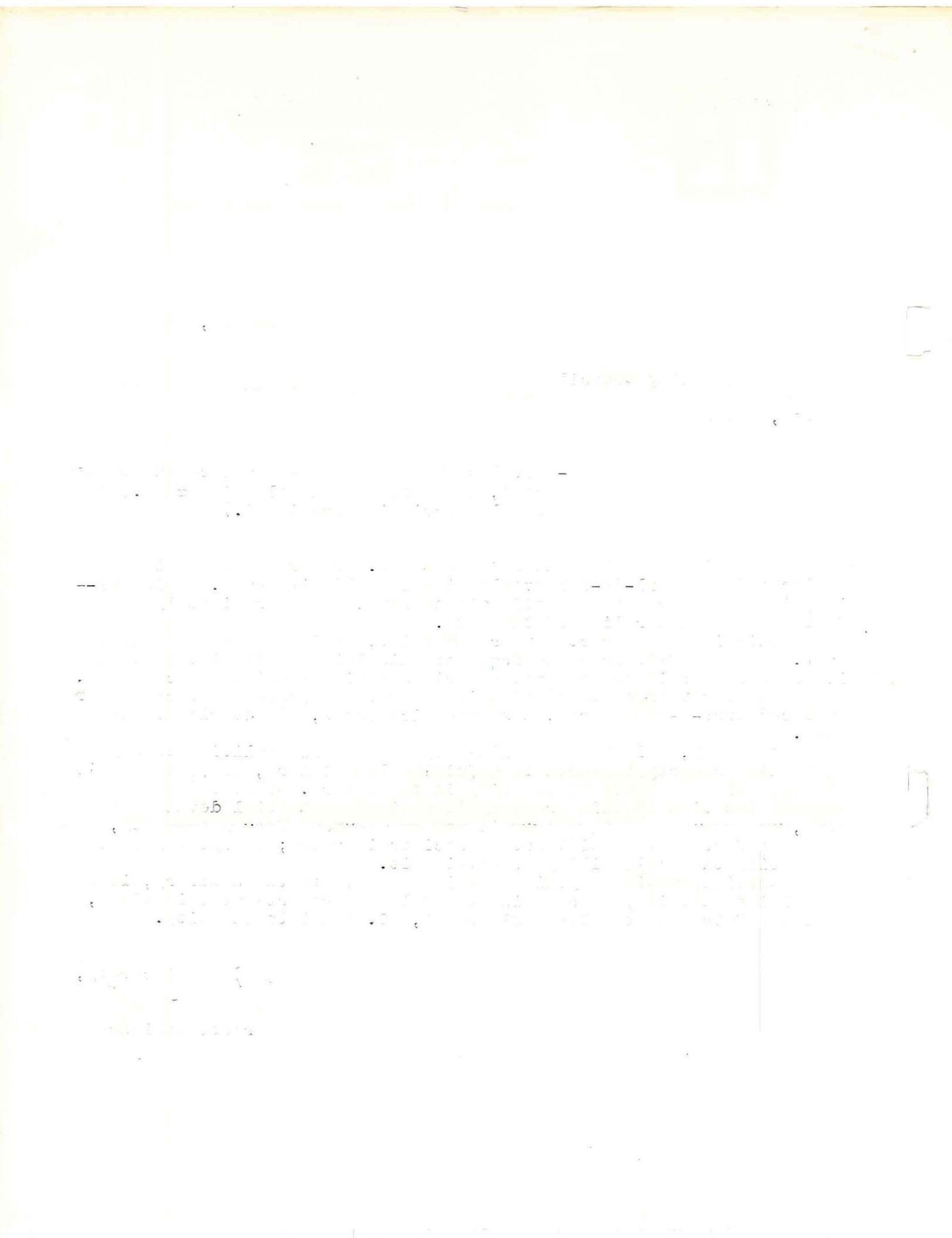
The front or east end of this property adjoins and faces a hard surfaced turn-a-round area, has some nice trees, and overlooks the lake.

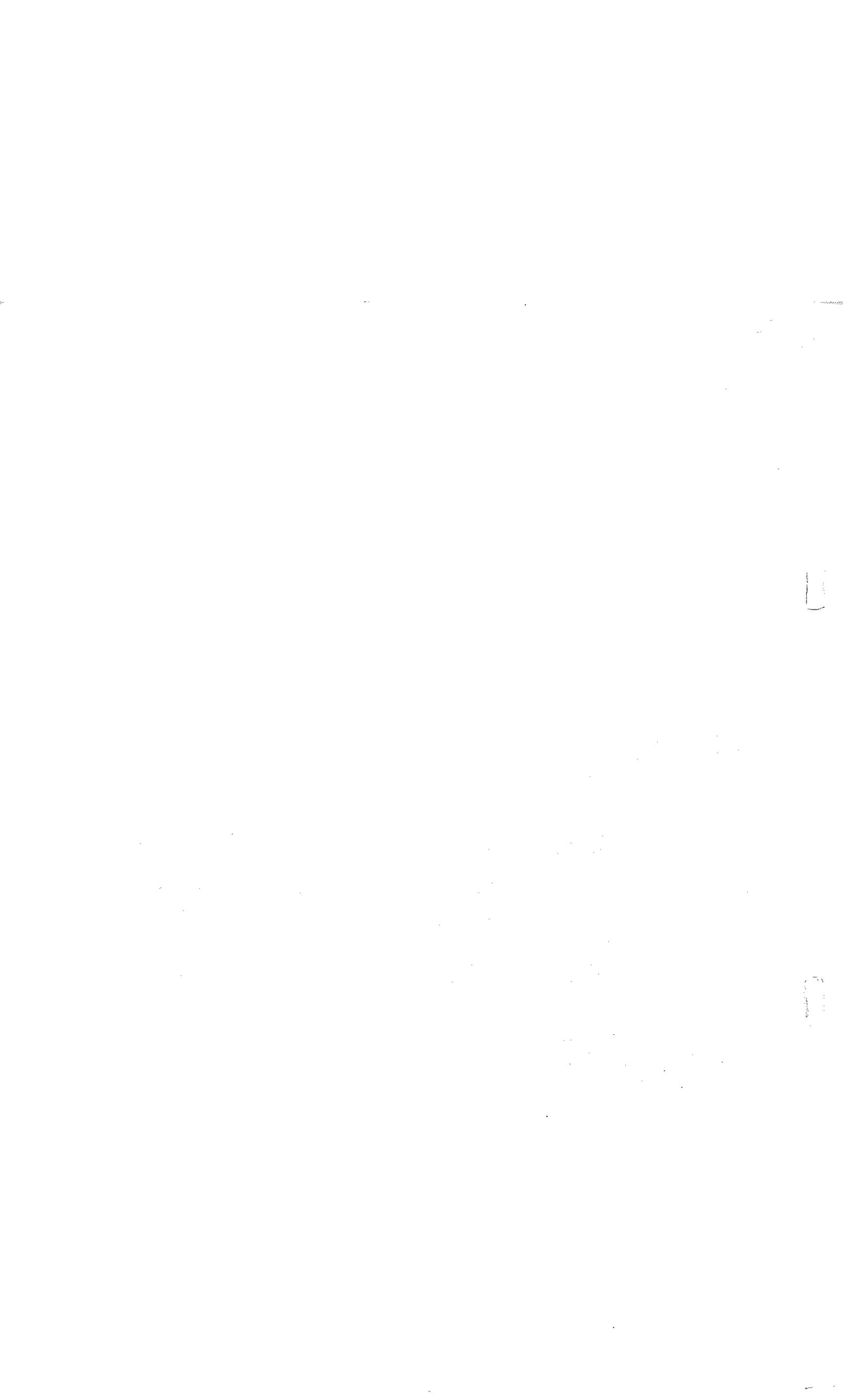

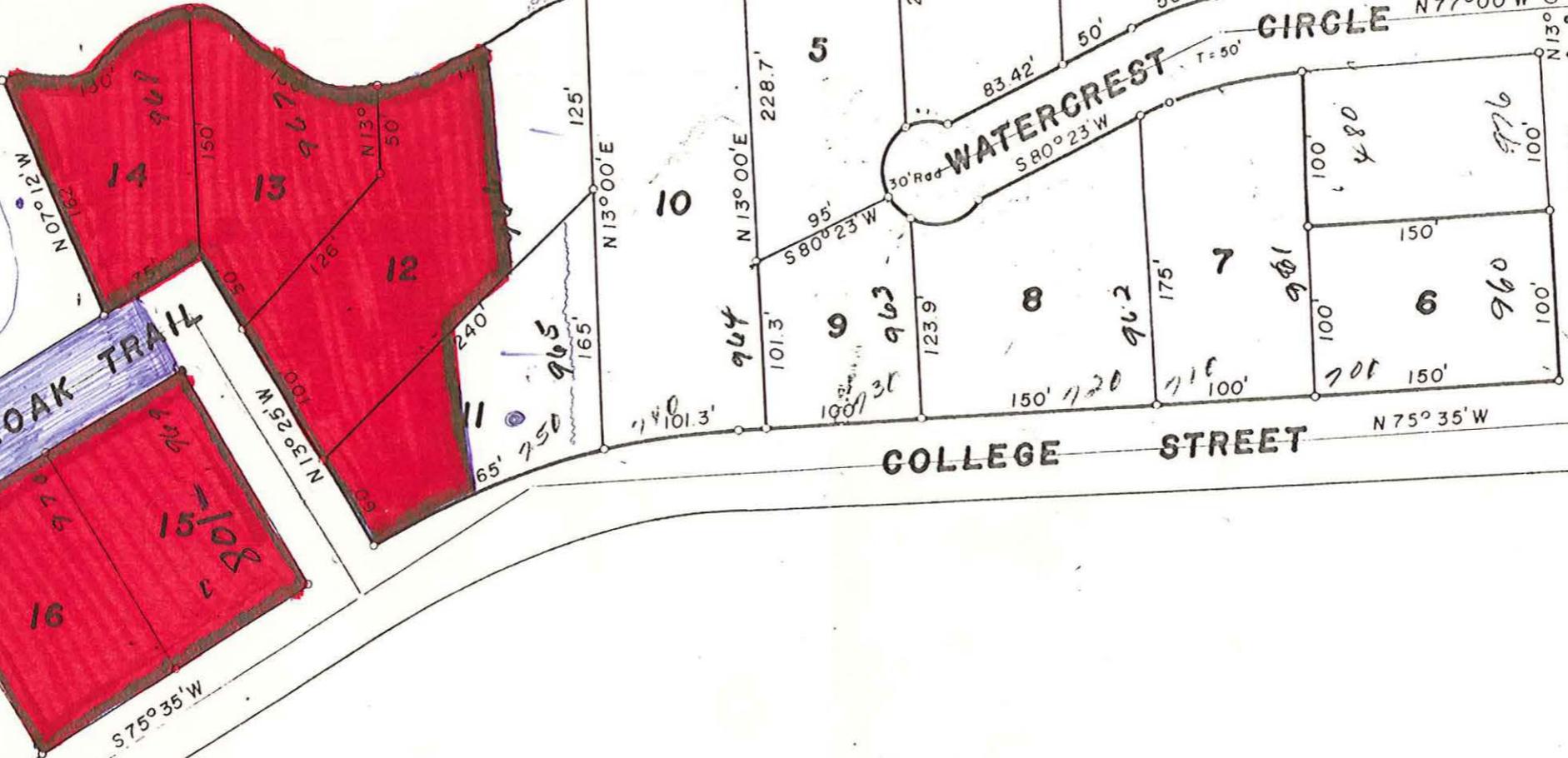

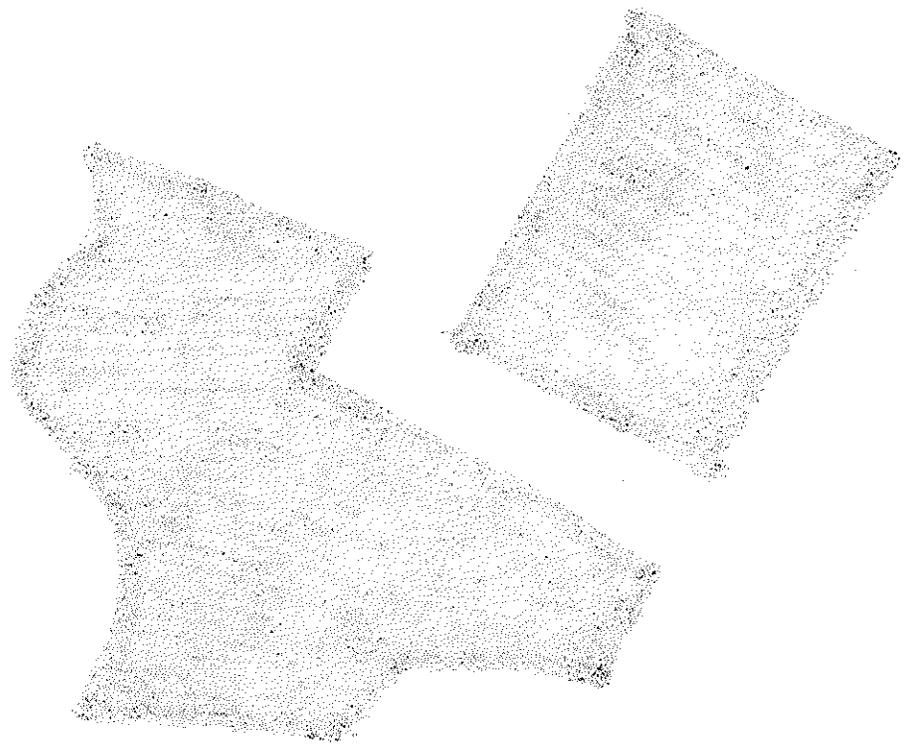

WHEREAS, the OFFICE OR AGENCY must examine all plans and specifications for the proposed construction when application is made to him for a building permit.

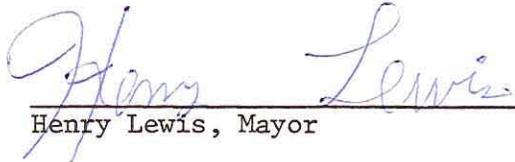
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the CANTON CITY COUNCIL of CANTON as follows:

The Canton City Council met in a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Russell Eubank and Sam Hilliard. Absent were Dennis Mann and Herman Heard.

The minutes from the previous meetings were read. They were approved as read.

The Financial Statement was presented. It was approved as given.

Mr. Bill Skidmore came before the Council representing T P & L requesting an 11% rate increase. After a lengthy discussion, Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion that T P & L be granted a rate increase equivalent to the smallest rate increase granted among the cities they serve as well as any deletions in rate requests. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. Two voted in favor, one voted against. (* see last page)

Next on the agenda was the appointment of a health officer. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion that Dr. Dan Hilliard be appointed City Health Officer. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All in favor. Gerald Turner is to contact Dr. Hilliard and advise him of the appointment.

Mayor Lewis presented the year-end audit report from Squyres, Johnson and Squyers. The Mayor recommended that the Council study the report and bring back any recommendations and/or approval at the next Council meeting.

Mr. Lee Owens came before the Council regarding a First Monday lot. After an explanation of the situation, Sam Hilliard made the motion that Mr. Owens be charged \$18.00 for the three spaces he now occupies instead of the customary \$27.00 and that he be given a refund of \$9.00 for the spaces for the month of August. If lots 779 and 780 become available for reservation, Mr. Owens is to have first preference for these two particular spaces. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. gave the Police and Fire Department reports. Mr. Peace requested that Gerald Turner check into the \$3,000.00 tax exemptions for persons over 65 years of age, and bring this information back to the next Council meeting for discussion.

Russell Eubank gave the office report. Sam Hilliard made the motion that Gerald Turner contact Cecil Tawater for a list of inoperable fire hydrants so they

can be made operable as soon as possible. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All in favor.

Personnel in the office was discussed. Sam Hilliard made the motion, seconded by Billy Jack Peace, Jr., that Paula Reno be approved as a temporary employee in the office until such time as Mayor Lewis and Russell Eubank see that she is no longer needed. All in favor. Sam Hilliard made the motion that Joey Peace be approved as temporary help for clearing brush on the First Monday Grounds until such time Mayor Lewis and Herman Heard see he is no longer needed. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All in favor.

Sam Hilliard gave a report of the dump grounds, water and sewer department and Hillcrest Cemetery. The rates at the dump grounds were discussed.

Mayor Lewis presented a plan before the Council for a log cabin to be constructed on the First Monday Grounds for the bi-centennial on July 4, 1976, and used for an office building.

Sam Hilliard made the motion that the Revenue Sharing money for the last two years be reallocated for hot-topping the streets between Big Rock Street and Woodland Drive. Dennis Mann and Mayor Lewis are to work out the best deal possible with Commissioner Wycough. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Gerald Turner presented a statement from the Soil Conservation Service in the amount of \$14,000.00 for work completed at the new City Lake site. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion, seconded by Russell Eubank, that this bill be paid. All in favor.

Electricity for the new lots numbered at the First Monday Grounds was discussed. Gerald Turner advised that there was a need for seven (7) utility poles to be put up in this area. The cost of these poles being approximately \$75.00 per pole.

Herman Heard made a written recommendation that all City employees with five years of service or more receive two weeks paid vacation each year. This matter was passed due to Mr. Heard's absence.

The Council went into Executive Session (6:30 P.M.)

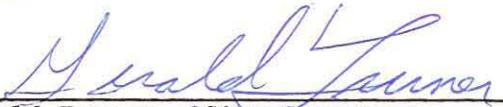

The Canton City Council met in a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Russell Eubank, Herman Heard, Sam Hilliard, and Dennis Mann.

The minutes from the previous meetings were read. Sam Hilliard made a motion that the minutes be approved with the exception of (1) \$3,000.00 tax exemptions for persons over 65 years of age, (2) Revenue Sharing money for the last two years be reallocated for hot-topping the streets between Big Rock Street and Woodland Drive, and (3) the placement of 30 minute parking signs around the square to ease the parking problem on Saturday of First Monday weekend. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mayor Henry Lewis read Herman Heard's letter of resignation. Dennis Mann made the motion to accept his resignation and all council members gave their approval. Mr. Heard was presented a plaque by the City Council for his seven years service.

The Financial Statement was presented and approved.

Mr. Bill Skidmore, representing Texas Power & Light, came before the council requesting an 11% rate increase. (Mr. Skidmore made his presentation at the last City Council meeting, July 15, but was unable to receive action on the matter due to the absence of two City Council members). Mayor Lewis recommended that the City authorize this increase exactly as it was voted on last month. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion to approve the increase; Russell Eubank seconded the motion. Three (Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Russell Eubank, Dennis Mann) voted for; one (Sam Hilliard) voted against.

Mr. Baker, representing Lone Star Gas, requested the adoption of an ordinance which would provide them with an 11% rate increase. He also asked for any ideas and suggestions to be submitted that the citizens of this community might have for improving its service. Mr. Baker assured the City that it was their intent to provide natural gas service at the lowest price possible. Mayor Lewis recommended passage of this ordinance. Russell Eubank made the motion to grant Lone Star Gas this increase. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. Three (Dennis Mann, Billy Jack Peace, Jr., Russell Eubank) voted for; one (Sam Hilliard) voted against.

Jerry Don Priest came before the City Council requesting a building permit on 510 East Hwy. 243. Mr. Priest discussed with the Council the lack of water and sewer lines on this lot. The Council told Mr. Priest that they would provide the labor for the installation of water and sewer lines with Mr. Priest providing the cost of the materials. The City will lay a 6" water line with Mr. Priest paying for a 2" line. Sam Hilliard made a motion that the City issue a building permit to Mr. Priest. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All approved.

Weldon Starnes and his attorney, Mr. Ted Odom, came before the City Council. Mr. Odom presented a letter to the Council which Mayor Lewis read. It was recommended that the City prepare a list for Mr. Starnes of the persons and their addresses, which the City maintains records of, who utilize his garbage service and present the same to him as soon as possible. Sam Hilliard put this recommendation into motion; Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All approved. Mr. Starnes asked for a rate increase of \$1.00, making the total cost of his garbage service \$4.00, with one-fourth of this amount going to the City. Anyone not wishing his service can notify the City, the City in turn will notify Mr. Starnes, and their service will be discontinued the following month. The Council was in agreement with

Mr. Starnes' request for a rate increase providing (1) he presents the Council with an expense breakdown showing cause for an increase, (2) the ordinance is re-written to remove all mandatory restrictions, and (3) the removal of past obligations that may have incurred. Sam Hilliard recommended that Mr. Odom be hired to prepare a new draft of the ordinance and present it to the City Council.

Mr. Starnes requested a raise of \$15.00 (\$60.00 to \$75.00 monthly) for the hauling of First Monday. Mayor Lewis stated that the City would start hauling themselves. Mr. Starnes also brought up the problem of the country dumping before the Council. Mr. Hilliard stated that revisions regarding this were badly needed and would look into the situation.

Mr. Ross's request for a building permit on the Old Kaufman Road west of Nichols Road (part of Ross Subdivision) was granted.

Fire plugs requiring attention were discussed. Russell Eubank made a motion for Sam Hilliard and Gerald Turner to check these out. All in favor.

The purchase of a load of pre-mix for the streets was the next item on the agenda. It was decided that the City could not purchase this at the present time.

The problem of Saturday parking over a First Monday weekend was discussed. The thirty minute limit parking last First Monday proved to be unsatisfactory and was agreed this would be discontinued. It was decided that Hoss Williams would notify the merchants that a one-hour parking limit would be issued this coming First Monday and any merchant who wished to file a complaint would have ten days to do so.

The City received the "Special Examination Report" from the State Comptroller's office in Austin. The report states that "no specific amount of shortage can be stated for the period of examination due to the limitations which were present and that the disposition of the probable discrepancies cannot be determined due to the lack of documentary evidence." Sam Hilliard recommended that this matter be turned over to an attorney to see what the responsibilities of the bonding company are. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. placed the recommendation in motion; Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All approved.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. gave the Police and Fire Departments reports. Sam Hilliard requested that Mr. Peace have the Police Department maintain a log for gasoline expenses. Also, for Gerald Turner to maintain a log on the City vehicles. Mayor Lewis asked Gerald Turner to notify all the service stations where we purchase gasoline and request that they put the vehicle number on the charge ticket. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. requested that the City paint strips both ways at the stop signs on Elm Street and Big Rock Street.

Dennis Mann, Russell Eubank, and Sam Hilliard gave reports on their assigned areas.

Meeting adjourned to Executive Session (10:00 p.m.)

The condemnation case of Reynolds & Burns was discussed. The Council unanimously decided that we would pay a total of \$1,000.00 for each easement.

Sam Hilliard is to contact Wise, Baker & Fix regarding the plans for a new water line from the new city lake into town.

Mayor Lewis was authorized to contact an attorney regarding the citation he received relating to Mill Creek Lake.

The appointment of a new Councilman to fill Herman Heard's unexpired term was discussed. It was unanimously decided that the Council would not appoint a new Councilman at this time.

Russell Eubank was authorized to hire a replacement for the existing vacancy in the City Office.

Dennis Mann was placed in charge of First Monday due to the resignation of Herman Heard.

Motion was made by Billy Jack Peace, Jr. to give all City employees a 2-week vacation after 5-years of service. The motion did not receive a second. Mayor Lewis recommended that all City employees be given a 2-week vacation after 10- years of service. No motion was made.

Executive Session meeting adjourned.

Also, that a lien would be filed against the property if payment was not received. The County Clerk is also to be notified of the action taken.

Payment of the year-end audit of \$2500.00 to Squyres, Johnson, Squyres & Company was approved.

A Reserve Fund of \$17,777.46 was approved. This fund will be deposited at Athens Federal Savings & Loan and will be added to as funds become available.

Authorization was given to Billy Jack Peace, Jr. and Chief Williams to hire a policeman under the Title 6 Manpower program. The entire salary will be paid by grant money through the local Manpower Office.

The City Secretary was instructed to contact all downtown businesses to determine if they desire a 30 minute, 1 hour, or 2 hour parking limit in front of their businesses on Saturday of the First Monday weekend. A record is to be maintained of all businesses that keep these signs in their businesses.

Sam Hilliard made a motion to appoint B. R. Mahaffey to fill the unexpired term of Herman Heard. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mr. Turner requested several members of the City Council be present to welcome the group and also have lunch with them at the Van Zandt County Country Club.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. reported on the Police and Fire Departments. A new policeman, Mr. Jack Thompson, has been hired under the Title 6 Manpower program. The Council also discussed the requirement that two emergency lights must be atop any police vehicle by January. Hoss Williams was instructed to check into the prices of the lights.

Councilman Peace requested that several street lights, which are out, be reported to Texas Power & Light.

The Canton City Council met in a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Russell Eubank, Sam Hilliard, B. R. Mahaffey, Dennis Mann, and Billy Jack Peace, Jr.

The minutes from the previous meeting were read. The following additions and/or changes were made.

- (a) Dump Ground Rates (Page 2, par. 1) - Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion that all tickets be purchased at the City Hall during office hours. B. R. Mahaffey seconded the motion. All in favor.
- (b) Fireworks Ordinance (Page 2, par. 5) - Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion for this ordinance to become effective December 1st. Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All in favor.
- (c) City's Trailer House Ordinance (Page 3, par. 1) - The insertion of the parties name (R. C. Westmoreland) to whom the exemption was granted.

Sam Hilliard made the motion to approve the minutes with the above additions and/or changes. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Messrs. Newman and Stone, Hart Engineering firm of Longview, met with the Council to suggest ways they might be of help to the City regarding future water and sewer problems that might be coming up with the Texas Water Quality Board. Dennis Mann made a motion that Mr. Stone, acting in an advisory capacity, send the necessary information to Mr. Turner and Councilman Sam Hilliard for study. They will report back to the Council. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Beryle Roberts, speaking for E. C. Johnson, Mr. Woods, and Mr. Cobb, requested permission to extend a water line a little over half a mile at their own expense. Mr. Turner is to contact Roberts regarding the Council's decision.

Mrs. Jameson, Sides Circle, met with the Council regarding the problem she is having with dogs coming into her yard. Mayor Lewis explained that the City did not have the money to operate a dog pound. Mayor Lewis requested Councilman Peace to look into possible state funding for dog facilities.

Leon Bomar requested permission to lease 10 acres located on Hwy. 64 from the City. Mayor Lewis stated the City's policy had been not to lease any property at this time, but to wait until the lake is completed and filled before making a decision as to whether the City will lease any property or not. Mr. Bomar is to send a letter to the City Secretary to be placed on file.

S. C. Broyles and Frank Stringer met with the Council concerning high grass on private property within the city limits. Mayor Lewis requested Mr. Turner to take care of this matter.

Russell Eubank introduced Shirley Hudson, recently hired employee for the City.

Mr. J. W. LeNoir met with the Council to voice his opinion on several matters. They are as follows:

- (a) The collection of the extra \$1 for vendors who enter the grounds on Friday. Mr. Turner stated that efforts were now being made to collect this money.
- (b) The \$1 charge for the use of electricity. Mr. LeNoir stated that the city employees stopped collecting this fee last First Monday because of the rain. Mayor Lewis recommended when a health hazard is involved for Gerald Turner to notify Dennis Mann and Mr. Mann would make the final decision.
- (c) \$2 charge for vendors who rent lots outside the First Monday grounds. Dennis Mann recommended the study of better ways to handle the collection of this fee.
- (d) Re-evaluation of the taxes. Mr. LeNoir felt the changes in the taxes should not have become official until next year.
- (e) Bonding company regarding missing money. Mr. LeNoir feels the City shouldn't pay the bonding premiums for city employees if the bonding companies are not going to be responsible for funds taken by an employee (in reference to the missing funds of 1974). Mayor Lewis stated the city would continue bonding all employees and that an attorney was handling the other matter.
- (f) Mr. LeNoir stated that Hamp Heard has raw sewage running into his yard from two houses which are within the City limits. Mayor Lewis said that a Councilman would go to Mr. Heard's house to check on this problem. Mr. Hilliard will give a report on this next month.
- (g) Mr. LeNoir presented his letter of resignation from the Equalization Board to the City Council. The Council accepted his resignation.
- (h) Mr. LeNoir stated that a city employee was doing plumbing work on city time using city material. Mayor Lewis said that if citizens will put their complaints in writing, any employee who follows this practice will be suspended until the next council meeting when the facts can be discussed.

Sam Hilliard requested the Council to call a special meeting to discuss First Monday. Mayor Lewis stated that Dennis Mann was now making a study and would call a meeting when it is completed.

Mr. Stringer suggested a city sales tax as a fair way to bring in more revenue for the City. The Council did not feel this would pass because of the wide margin it was defeated by two years ago.

Sam Hilliard gave a report on the No. 1 Water Well which the City had repaired and is now in operation. No. 3 Water Well is now out of operation. The Council instructed Mr. Turner to contact Andrews & Foster of Athens, who repaired the No. 1 Well, to come look at this well and give their recommendation. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion to authorize Mr. Hilliard to have the pump pulled and find out the cost of putting this well back into working order. Russell Eubank seconded the motion. All in favor. Mr. Hilliard will call a meeting when he is ready to give his report.

The Council discussed the running of a water line to the site of the new school building. This line will also relieve low water pressure in the area. There will also be additional fire plugs installed. Estimated cost of this will be \$5,000.00 which will be spread over an 8-month period. Mr. Hilliard made a motion to install this line; Dennis Mann seconded the motion. All in favor.

Gerald Turner presented a Construction Agreement, sent by the Parks & Wildlife Department, which required the Mayor's signature. The Council was in agreement with the signing of this document. The Parks & Wildlife Department require an engineer to design the boat ramp. Russell Eubank made the motion to authorize B. R. Mahaffey, who will be in charge of the boat ramp, and the Mayor to select the engineering firm and begin laying the necessary ground work for the construction of this ramp. Sam Hilliard seconded the motion. All in favor.

A lengthy discussion was held by the Council on the Financial Statement. One way the Council discussed in cutting expenses was the cutting off of every other street light in the City. The elimination of half the lights on the First Monday grounds was also discussed. Mayor Lewis recommended the authorization of Dennis Mann to handle this matter. Sam Hilliard placed this into motion. All in favor.

Dennis Mann presented the Financial Statement for First Monday.

Meeting adjourned to Executive Session (11:15 p.m.)

Motion was made by Sam Hilliard, seconded by Dennis Mann that the salary paid to Gerald Turner from the First Monday Fund be paid in the future from the Water & Sewer Operating Fund. All in favor.

Motion was made by Sam Hilliard, seconded by Dennis Mann that Jan Malone be hired permanently. All in favor.

Motion was made by Russell Eubank, seconded by Dennis Mann that Jan Malone's salary be increased to \$2.90/hr. All in favor.

Motion was made by Sam Hilliard, seconded by Billy Jack Peace, Jr. that Shirley Hudson be hired on a 90-day trial period at a salary of \$2.50/hr. All in favor.

The Garbage Hauling Franchise was discussed. It was unanimously decided that an exception not be allowed that would permit Mr. Starnes to dump garbage at our City Dump unless the garbage was from within our City Limits or from residents outside our City if they utilize our water or sewer services.

The City Secretary was instructed to inform Mr. Starnes of this decision by Registered Mail and to also inform Mr. Starnes that if any further violations occur that our contract with him would be terminated.

Motion was made by Sam Hilliard, seconded by Billy Jack Peace, Jr. that the City purchase a tape recorder. All in favor.

A request by Mrs. Velma Foster by Council Mahaffey to widen Foster Street on Hwy. 19 was discussed. Mrs. Foster advised that she was willing to pay for the curb work and deed the necessary land to the City for a street if the City would take care of the building of the street. The City Secretary was advised to check into this and report back to the Council.

A motion was made by Dennis Mann that all adjustments on water bills be approved by the Council with the exception of reading or billing errors. The motion was seconded by Russell Eubank. All in favor.

The Canton City Council met in a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Henry Lewis presiding and the following members present: Sam Hilliard, Billy Jack Peace, Jr., and B. R. Mahaffey.

The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

At the November Council Meeting, Beryle Roberts, speaking for E. C. Johnson, Mr. Woods, and Mr. Cobbs, requested permission to extend a water line for a little over half a mile at their own expense. It was unanimously decided that the City allow the extension of this water line with the understanding that they, the above named, assume all responsibility, including the cost of all labor, material, and future maintenance and repairs required. This line would be layed under the supervision of the City, using a minimum 2" line. The normal tapping fees also would be required with the City retaining ownership when completed. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mrs. Velma Foster's request, made at the November Council Meeting, to widen Foster Street at Hwy. 19 was discussed. B. R. Mahaffey made a motion to authorize Gerald Turner, under Councilman Hilliard's supervision, to go ahead with this project. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mr. Verdell January met with the City Council to discuss the hazard of the latches on self-service gasoline pumps. Mr. January requested the Council to rule this as a fire hazard. Sam Hilliard recommended that Gerald Turner contact the other self-service stations and inform them that this matter will be discussed at the January meeting and that the Council is seriously considering ruling this as a fire hazard. Mayor Lewis requested Mr. Turner to follow through on Councilman Hilliard's recommendation.

The City has a sewer line running across the property of Mr. Carpenter which he states was done without an easement. Mr. Carpenter has requested the City to re-route this line. Mayor Lewis requested Mr. Turner to check into this, report his findings to Councilman Hilliard, and proceed with whatever action they feel necessary. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. placed this into motion; Sam Hilliard seconded the motion. All in favor.

Sam Hilliard made the motion to authorize Mayor Lewis \$200.00 to purchase advertising time on the radio for First Monday. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Billy Jack Peace, Jr. made the motion to authorize B. R. Mahaffey and Gerald Turner to build a fence across one end of the dam on Mill Creek Lake and to designate whatever they feel necessary as an restricted area at whatever cost necessary. Sam Hilliard seconded the motion. All in favor.

Sam Hilliard made a motion to retain the City's membership in the Texas Municipal League at a cost of \$160.00. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Gerald Turner informed the Council that Mr. Woods from the State Comptroller's Office had contacted him regarding the collection of the state sales tax from the First Monday vendors. Mr. Woods proposed that the City act as a collection agency. All members of the Council was in agreement that this

was the best way to handle the collection of this money. Two gentlemen from the State Comptroller's Office will be here Thursday, December 18 at 10:00 to finalize this matter. Sam Hilliard made the motion to authorize Mayor Lewis and Gerald Turner to sign the necessary papers. Billy Jack Peace, Jr. seconded the motion. All in favor.

Councilmen Hilliard, Peace, and Mahaffey gave reports on their assigned areas.

Mayor Lewis advised the Council of Attorney Bob Bartlett's opinion regarding the curb at the Service Cafe. Mayor Lewis stated the City could not have the curb removed due to safety factors involved.

Meeting adjourned to Executive Session (8:30 p.m.)
