The City Council met on January 19, 1982 at the regularly scheduled time of seven (7:00) p.m. in the Canton City Hall. All members of the council were present.

Gerald Turner read the minutes and Arnold Paul read the financial statement. Expenses exceeding the budget were explained. Mayor Peace asked for a motion to approve which Arnold Paul did with Howard Paul Stegall seconding the motion. The council voted in favor.

Henry Lewis approached the council with the request for water and sewer on a part of his property near the First Monday grounds. This property is not in the city limits and the council stated it must be before these privileges are granted. John Norman made a motion to bring one acre of Mr. Lewis's land into the city limits. Arnold Paul seconded the motion Howard Paul Stegall voted against while the remaining members voted in favor.

Mayor Peace informed the council and guests of a donation in the amount of \$2,000.00 made to the city by Athens Federal Savings and Loan. No stipulations were given, however, it was requested that the donation be used for improvement of the City Park, i.e. to pave the road around the park.

G. E. Terry submitted a request to bring a new sub-division into the city limits. After discussion the request was tabled in order to acquire more information.


The Mayor introduced Wayne Weeks and Neil Velvin who presented more complete information concerning the new water plant. The plant size and operation was reviewed and clarified, as well as the cost.


The council was then adjourned to the executive session. Discussion was held regarding the employment of Cloyce Perkins.

The council moved back to an open session and Raymond Pruitt made a motion to pay Mr. Perkins a \$120.00 salary for working the First Monday weekend. Howard Paul Stegall seconded the motion and it carried.

The water plant was discussed once again. A motion was made by Howard Paul Stegall and seconded by John Norman that the City proceed with plans to build a two million gallon plant. All council voted in favor.

All business was concluded and the meeting adjourned.


February 3, 1982

The Canton City Council met on February 16, 1982 at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall in a regularly scheduled meeting. All members of the council were present.

The minutes were read by Gerald Turner. They were approved as read following a motion by Maxie Turner and seconded by Howard Stegall with all council members voting in favor.

Arnold Paul read the financial statement, then made a motion to accept the statement. Raymond Pruitt seconded the motion and it carried.

The Catholic Church requested city water to their new building site. Raymond Pruitt made a motion to grant city water on the contingency the Church pay all installation expenses. Howard Stegall seconded the motion and members voted in favor with John Norman voting against.

Bill Bedrick with TP&L informed the council of a requested rate increase of 15%. Raymond Pruitt motioned a suspension of action for 120 days with Arnold Paul seconding. Everyone was in favor.

Don Barrier and Billy Montgomery, who represented the CYRA, presented financial statistics of the CYRA park. A motion was made by Raymond Pruitt to donate \$5,000.00 and 1/2 the electricity for the coming year to this organization. Arnold Paul seconded the motion and it carried.

Jim Fuller asked for approval from the City Council on the chosen dates of August 20, 21 and 22 for the annual Blue Grass Festival. The Council approved.

The City Council voted to change employee savings plan from Charter Security to Great American Reserve providing each employee is in favor of such a change.

The Council set the city election for the 1st Saturday in April which will be April 3, 1982. Three election judges were appointed, these judges being Mrs. Carla Mae Wallace, Mr. J. W. Terry, and Mr. Foy Riley. Maxie Turner motioned to accept all these decisions and Howard Stegall seconded. The motion carried.


Gerald Turner presented a plat of Wade Whitaker's building plans on Buffalo Street and asked for a variance in the building code of the City, which defines construction materials in the downtown area. The council voted in favor to grant the variance for a brick veneer with a metal roof. Raymond Pruitt made the motion, John Norman seconded, and all voted in favor. Mayor pro tem Stegall presided over this item due to the withdrawal of Mayor Peace, who has an interest in this building.

After the conclusion of the items on the agenda, Howard Stegall brought to the attention of the council complaints he had received regarding video game machines within the City. The Council decided to gather more information on this, and will consider approving an ordinance guarding such games.

The City Council then adjourned to the executive session where the status of four temporary employees was discussed.

Adjourning to an open session, Maxie Turner made a motion and Howard Stegall seconded the motion, to change the status of Carol Beal, Teresa Green, Pat Morris and Chuck Morris from temporary to permanent employees with a \$50.00 per month increase in wages. The council voted in favor, thank goodness.

All business being concluded, Mayor Peace adjourned the meeting.

March 16, 1982
City of Canton, Texas

The city council meeting of March 16, 1982 was called to order by Mayor Peace. All council members were present.

Gerald Turner read the minutes which were approved. Maxie Turner made the motion which John Norman seconded.

Arnold Paul read the financial statement and Howard Stegall made the motion to approve with Raymond Pruitt giving the second.

The Canton Chamber of Commerce presented its plans to host a clean-up month (April) and Mr. Howard Buck who presented the plans asked for city support. The City agreed to supplement the drive with garbage pick-up, free use of the city dump for one week, and urging the citizens to clean-up their lawns and vacant lots.

Mr. Don Brown with the East Texas Chamber of Commerce presented an advertising layout for 1st. Monday. Mayor Peace appointed a committee consisting of Raymond Pruitt, Anita Wilson, Howard Buck, and Gerald Turner to further investigate the benefits of such a program and to meet with the E.T.C. of C. to devise a plan to promote industry in Canton.

Bill Estes updated the council on the revenue bonds for the water plant and the City's application to the water development board for a loan to build the plant.

The tennis association brought a list of improvement requests for the council to consider regarding the City tennis courts. These requests include better maintenance of restrooms, grass mowing, court repair, and backdrop repair. The City promised to fulfill and/or consider the items.

Gerald Turner informed the council of the poor radio communication now being used and requested new radios for the fire dept. Raymond Pruitt made a motion to purchase radios for the amount of \$1,800.00. This was seconded by Arnold Paul and the council approved.

Mr. Turner brought to the attention of the council that the Texas Municipal League intends to fight the rate increase requested by General Telephone and would like the help and support of the City of Canton. Discussion was tabled at this time.

The 1982 proposed budget was presented. A motion was made by Arnold Paul to accept the budget and seconded by Howard Stegall after the following changes were made in the First Monday budget.

\$5,000.00 transferred to Misc. & Emergency to the City Park fund
\$5,000.00 transferred from Misc. & Emergency to the Advertising,
increasing that fund to \$13,000.00.

Mr. Turner then presented to the council an ordinance used by Terrell regarding electronic games. The council tabled this matter.

Howard Paul made a motion to give control of rate-making decisions with Texas Power and Light to the Public Utility Commission. John Norman seconded the motion and it carried 3 to 2 with Raymond Pruitt and Arnold Paul voting against the decision.

The Mayor adjourned the meeting to the Executive Session.

The Council meeting was reopened and Maxie Turner made a motion that raises be given to the following employees.

Part time: Mrs. Woodrow Janes
Miss Porter
Mr. J. C. Cross
Police Officers - All these will be raised to \$4.25
per hour

Police Secretary: Will be raised to \$4.00 per hour.

Part time: One year or more of service will be raised to \$3.60 per hour.

Mr. Woodrow Janes: Will be raised to \$500.00 per month.

March 16, 1982 (Cont'd)

Full Time: Employees with less than 6 months service will be given a 5% increase effective on completion of six months service (May 1982). All other full time employees receive a 10% increase with the exception of D. G. Williams and Gerald Turner, who will receive a 15% increase.

Howard Stegall seconded the motion and all council members voted in favor.

The video game ordinance was discussed again. A motion was made by Raymond Pruitt and seconded by Howard Stegall to adopt a video game ordinance similar to the City of Terrell's ordinance. However, the fee permit will be increased to \$100.00 and the hours of operation will be different. All voted in favor.

All business being concluded, the meeting was adjourned by Mayor Peace.

April 20, 1982

On April 20, 1982 the Canton City Council met for a regularly scheduled 7 p.m. meeting in the Canton City Hall. Mayor Peace welcomed the councilmen who were all present, the guests, and the visitors.

Gerald Turner read the minutes. Howard Stegall made a motion to approve the minutes as read. Arnold Paul seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The financial statement was read by Arnold Paul, who made a motion to approve. Raymond Pruitt seconded and the council approved.

Mr. J. W. Lenoir wished to express his thanks for all the help and support he received in his effort to help the victims of the tornado in Paris. Mayor Peace then presented Mr. Lenoir with a plaque from the City in appreciation.

The 1982 City election was canvassed. A total of 122 votes were cast. Raymond Pruitt received 114, Howard Stegall received 105, and Anita Wilson received 109, which was previously recorded as 108. John Norman made a motion to accept the election. Raymond Pruitt seconded.

The new council people were sworn in by Gerald Turner. The newest member is Anita Wilson. Howard Stegall and Raymond Pruitt will each be serving a second term. The oath of office was repeated, Mayor Peace welcomed the new and returning members, and wished John Norman success and extended the City's appreciation for a job well done. Mr. Norman was also presented a plaque by the Mayor. Mayor Protem for the coming term was selected. Howard Stegall nominated Arnold Paul for the position. Maxie Turner seconded and the choice was unanimous.

A copy of Terrell's game room ordinance was presented. Gary Hatfield presented his arguments against such an ordinance, expressly the number of machines that constitutes a game room and the fee imposed. After discussion, two amendments were made. Any business with a game machine must submit a fee. The ordinance was accepted after Raymond Pruitt made a motion to accept and Howard Stegall seconded the motion.

Mr. Turner asked to begin taking bids for a new truck. Howard Stegall made a motion to accept bids and Arnold Paul seconded. The motion carried.

The council chose to disregard the ninth item on the agenda, the annexation of the Travis, Hackney and Lewis land, since all legal information was not available.

The matter of abandoning a proposed street in the Mitchell addition was tabled. The Council felt more information was needed before a decision could be made.

Gerald Turner recommended the Kenneth Williams Accounting firm and J. L. Heard, III be contracted in reference to the audit of the 1980-1981 books. Raymond Pruitt made a motion to authorize Mayor Peace to select the firm with the fee not to exceed \$1,800.00. Howard Stegall seconded. The council voted in favor.

Mayor Peace adjourned the council meeting to the executive session. After returning to an open session, the council voted to enter into an advertising campaign with the East Texas Chamber of Commerce to stimulate industrial growth in Canton. Raymond Pruitt made the motion and Arnold Paul seconded.







Jim Fuller talked with the council about the Texas Blue Grass Festival to be held on the First Monday Grounds on August 20, 21, and 22 of this year. There is a conflict of dates with the Van Zandt County Fair and Mr. Fuller assured the council that he would cooperate all he could with the Fair.

Neal Velvin and Wayne Weeks of Athens, and the consulting engineers for the City, showed preliminary sketches of the proposed water plant. They also gave estimated costs for solving the runoff waters at the intersection of Highway 198 and Oak Street.

Roy Faubion, representative of Broadcasters Unlimited, Inc. of Tyler, along with David Mooney and Aubrey Irby made a presentation, to the council, concerning the installation of Cable TV within the City. The Council tabled the matter until other companies could present their programs.

The Council gave Weldon Starns a three-year extension on the garbage hauling contract. Motion by Raymond Pruitt and seconded by Howard Paul Stegall. All in favor.

Several landowners met with the Council to discuss the proposed development of the West Side property. The cost of water and sewer lines being extended to include this property was discussed. The project was tabled until the landowners had a chance to study the proposed cost.

The final public hearing was held on the annexation of the Lewis, Hackney and Travis property. No one appeared to speak for or against. The proposed annexation was approved by the Council with a motion from Maxie Turner and seconded by Arnold Paul. All were in favor.

The Council authorized Gerald Turner to negotiate terms on a gas lease at the Old City Lake property.

Gerald Turner reported on a study of the Canton Rural Water Supply rates. After discussion the Council approved a rate increase of 10¢ per 1000 gallons. On a motion by Maxie Turner, seconded by Arnold Paul the Council voted unanimously to increase the rate from 85¢ per 1000 gallons to 95¢ per 1000 gallons.

Adjourned to executive session.

The Council discussed the proposed development of the West Side Property. Several of the landowners had requested that this property be annexed in order that this new development can have city water and sewer. The matter was tabled until the Monday meeting.


The problem of runoff water on Oak Drive and Highway 198 was discussed. Neal Velvin is to write the Highway Department to see if the state will share the cost.


Approval was given to purchase a new copier for the office and a new garbage truck for use on the First Monday Grounds.

The minutes of the August 17, 1982 and August 23, 1982 meetings were read by Gerald Turner. A motion was made by Anita Wilson and seconded by Maxie Turner to approve the minutes as read.

The financial statement was reviewed by Arnold Paul and was approved with a motion from Arnold Paul and seconded by Howard Stegall.

Henry Lewis approached the council about taking over 2 acres to rent to vendors on First Monday week-ends on a 50-50 basis. This land is paved and equipped with electricity. The matter was tabled at this time.

Tommy Barker, president of the Van Zandt County Fair Association, and Jim Fuller, promoter of the Blue Grass Festival, met with the council to discuss dates for next years Fair and Blue Grass Festival. After discussion it was decided that the Blue Grass Festival would be held August 17-20, 1983.

Cable TV was discussed at length with three companies, whose representatives were at the meeting. The matter was tabled until a called meeting to be held on Monday, August 27, 1982 when a decision will be made.

Leeman Cole, representative of the Soccer Association, met with the Council to ask for a number of improvements on the soccer facilities. The Association ask for poles and lights on one field, a chain link fence, restrooms, ground leveled for a new field, a driveway and a parking area. The request will be considered for next year's budget.

Canton Hackney Airport - tabled

Howard Buck, President of the Chamber of Commerce, met with the Council to ask for a donation toward additional Christmas decorations to be used around the Court House. The Council took the matter under advisement and will give Mr. Buck their answer as soon as possible.

September 21, 1982 Meeting Cont'd.

Garbage fees were discussed and on a motion from Raymond Pruitt and seconded by Howard Stegall the following rates were adopted with a unanimous vote:

Water Department Billing

Residential - from \$5.00 per month to \$5.50 per month
Business - Rates will be set by Starnes Trucking

Collections at City Dump

Residential customers on garbage hauling - Free for normal house hold
garbage only
Canton Volunteer Firemen - Free for normal house hold garbage only
Residential customers living inside City Limits that are not on garbage
hauling - Minimum charge \$3.00
Residential Customers living outside City Limits - Minimum charge \$5.00
Businesses Inside City Limits - Minimum charge \$4.00
Businesses Outside City Limits - Minimum charge \$8.00

The above charges are minimum charges for small loads. Larger loads will be charged accordingly.

Businesses, if they so desire, may charge each load. The water department will bill each business along with the monthly water bill.

Combined loads, such as household garbage placed in with business garbage will be charged extra.

With a motion by Raymond Pruitt, seconded by Anita Wilson, the Council authorized the sale of \$300,000.00 of Certificates of Obligation to finance part of the water treatment plant.

With a motion from Maxie Turner and seconded by Arnold Paul the Council appointed Dr. Dan Hilliard as the City Health Officer.

A request for water, by Rev. Hostetter, for a business outside the city limits was denied by a motion from Raymond Pruitt and seconded by Maxie Turner. All were in favor.

The College Street land Annexation was tabled until all correspondance has been received by the City Office.

With a motion from Maxie Turner and seconded by Arnold Paul the Council approved an ordinance establishing a temporary 35 mile per hour speed limit at the intersection of Highways 198 and 243 until the road work is completed.

The 1982 Property Tax rate was discussed. Howard Stegall made a motion seconded by Anita Wilson, to set the 1982 tax rate at .132 per \$100.


After discussion on the Appraisal District's Budget Maxie Turner made a motion, seconded by Howard Stegall, to reject the 1982 budget.


The City Council met in a special called meeting in the City Hall at 7:00 p.m. on September 27, 1982.




1. The permit will not be extended if there are any complaints.






