

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
JANUARY 20, 1987, 8:00 P.M.

The City Council met at 8:00 p.m. in the City Hall at a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Teal presiding. All members were present.

The minutes of the December 16 meeting were read by Gerald Turner. Ronnie Fugate motioned to accept the minutes as read. Don Hackney seconded the motion and all were in favor.

The financial statement was reviewed by Raymond Pruitt. Maxie Turner motioned to accept the financial statement with Ronnie Fugate seconding. All were in favor.

Ellis Clark, representing the CVRA, spoke to the Council requesting money for the Little League Park. He requested a donation the same as last year's, \$5,000, and that the City pay for the electricity. Raymond Pruitt motioned, with Maxie Turner seconding, to give the CVRA the \$5,000 donation and pay the electrical bill. All were in favor.

Ronnie Fugate, chairman of the street project committee, spoke to the Council concerning the various improvement plans for the next year. He brought to the Council's attention the possibility of obtaining a grant to re-do College Street in conjunction with the County. He suggested that the City apply immediately for the grant. Ronnie Fugate motioned to apply for the grant, with Don Hackney seconding the motion. All were in favor.

The second public hearing on the annexation of the Patel, Wheeler-Featherston, Sidas, Heard, Gilmer and Etheridge property was held. As there were no objections voiced, the public hearing was closed and the final hearing scheduled for February 2, 1987.

The Van Zandt County Peace Officers Association's request for a parcel of property at the New City Lake was brought to the attention of the Council. After a lengthy discussion, the matter was tabled for further discussion at a later date.

CALLED CITY COUNCIL MEETING
FEBRUARY 2, 1987, 7:00 P.M.

The City Council met at a called meeting on February 2, 1987, at 7:00 p.m. Due to Mayor Teal being tardy, Mayor Pro-tem Fugate appointed Maxie Turner to serve as temporary mayor.

The bids on the excavation of approximately 5,000 cubic yards of dirt at the landfill were opened. They were as follows:

Howard Stegall motioned to award the contract to the low bidder Hutcherson Dirt Contractors. Don Hackney seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Consideration of annexation of the Patel, Wheeler-Featherston, Sidas and Etheridge property was discussed. The Heard and Gilmer petitions had been withdrawn. Ronnie Fugate motioned to annex the property as stated with Don Hackney seconding the motion. All were in favor.

Howard Stegall motioned to adopt the animal ordinance as written with Ronnie Fugate seconding. Raymond Pruitt voted against the ordinance with Howard Stegall, Ronnie Fugate and Don Hackney voting in favor. The motion carried.

After discussion concerning the City Lake property, it was unanimously decided that a public hearing would be held on the

future use of the new City Lake property.

Raymond Pruitt motioned with Ronnie Fugate seconding, that the city contract with Charles Page to repair the yards on Forrest Drive that were damaged during the recent street repairs. The motion carried.

The council retired to executive session.

After returning to open session, Raymond Pruitt motioned with Howard Stegall seconding, that the City offer for sale, 30 acres of property fronting Cherry Creek Drive. All were in favor of the motion with the exception of Don Hackney, who voted against the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
FEBRUARY 17, 1967, 6:00 P.M.

The City Council met at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall at a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Teal presiding. All members were present.

The minutes of the January 20 and February 2 meetings were read by Gerald Turner. Howard Stegall motioned, with Ronnie Fugate seconding, to accept the minutes as read. All were in favor.

The Financial Statement was reviewed by Raymond Pruitt. Maxie Turner motioned to accept the Financial Statement. Don Hackney

seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Raymond Pruitt presented Ron Sanford and Bill Bethune with jackets in appreciation of the time and effort they donated to the City in various endeavors.

A public hearing was held concerning the city lake properties. The main question was whether or not the citizens of Canton want the City to maintain control of the properties or whether they would rather the Federal government had control. The public hearing was well attended and several citizens expressed their opinions. Richard Koonce, representing the Van Zandt County Peace Officers Association, rescinded their request for property at the new City Lake and instead stated that they would like property at FM 859.

Bank depository bids were received and opened. The bids were tabled at this time to enable the City's CPA to review the bids and make recommendations to the Council.

Raymond Pruitt motioned with Maxie Turner seconding, that the City advertise for bids for two new police cars. All were in favor.

Don Hackney motioned, with Raymond Pruitt seconding, to adopt the Flood Plain Damage Ordinance as written. All were in favor.

Gerald Turner spoke to the Council regarding the construction of First Monday entrances. Raymond Pruitt motioned that the City construct the entrances as proposed by Gerald Turner provided the money necessary for the construction be available. Maxie Turner seconded and all were in favor.

The need for a stop sign on College Street coming into town was discussed. It was also discussed about the possibility of putting

a four-way stop at the intersection of Little Rock, Wildwood, and Woodland. Ronnie Fugate motioned with Don Hackney seconding, to erect the stop signs as outlined. All were in favor.

After a brief recess, the Council retired to executive session.

After returning to open session, Ronnie Fugate motioned, with Raymond Pruitt seconding, to enter into a lease agreement with Barrier and Brown on the property owned by them on West Dallas Street and to enter into an agreement with John Crow for the use of the property. The motion carried 3-2, Maxie Turner and Don Hackney voting against.

The Council unanimously agreed to advertise for sale the warehouse property and the old fire hall property located on Edom Street.

The meeting adjourned.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
MARCH 17, 1987, 6:00 P.M.

The City Council met at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall at a regularly scheduled meeting with Mayor Teal presiding. All members were present.

The minutes of the February 17 and March 3 meetings were read by Gerald Turner. After corrections were made, Ronnie Fugate motioned to accept the Minutes with Maxie Turner seconding the motion. All were in favor.

Wade Whitaker spoke to the Council concerning the proposed street into the industrial property. After discussion, Mayor Teal assured Mr. Whitaker that the City intends to build the road as money permits. It was unanimously decided that a meeting between property owners, Gerald Turner, and other Council members would be held to further discuss the situation.

The Financial Statement was reviewed by Raymond Pruitt. Maxie Turner motioned with Ronnie Fugate seconding, to accept the statement. All were in favor.

John Fincher approached the Council with ideas for First Monday. He offered to construct a life size monument as a historical marker to be placed on the grounds. Smaller monuments would generate funds to pay for the larger monument. He proposed to sculpt 100 small monuments at no cost to the City to see how the sales would go. Ronnie Fugate motioned with Raymond Pruitt seconding, to have Mr. Fincher proceed with his proposal of the small monuments.

Bids for two new police vehicles were opened. Bids for the Chief's car were rejected from all bidders. A motion to purchase two police equipped cars from Canton Motors was made by Raymond Pruitt and seconded by Maxie Turner. All were in favor. The bids were as follows:

No bids were received on the sale of the warehouse property and old fire hall property.

Don Hackney motioned, with Raymond Pruitt seconding, to pass a Resolution adopting a local option homestead exemptions for the tax year 1987. All were in favor.

Gerald Turner presented to the Council recommendations for First Monday rate and procedure changes. The concession rates would be raised from \$75 for the first lot to \$125 for the first lot. He also recommended that a restriction be added to the waiting list for concessions in that a dealer must use the lot for one year before he can turn the lot back or sell his concession. After discussion, Raymond Pruitt motioned to approve the changes as outlined with Don Hackney seconding the motion. All were in favor.

Discussion was held on the proposed 1987 Budget. The Mayor recommended that employees' salaries not be adjusted by a cost of living raise this year but rather merit raises. He also suggested that instead of using two part time boys on street repairs that a current fulltime employee be put on the street repairs. Ronnie Fugate motioned to adopt the budget with changes. Raymond Pruitt seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Discussion was held concerning the passage of assessing a room occupancy tax for hotels and motels. The money so generated would be used for tourism. The City would furnish the motels with quarterly reports as to where and how the money was used. A representative from each motel would serve on a Board to govern the use of the money. Raymond Pruitt motioned that the ordinance be passed with Maxie Turner seconding. All were in favor.

Mayor Teal brought to the Council's attention that the Fire Department's subsidy received from the County only amounts to 4% of the actual cost of the Fire Department. He also informed the Council that the County had requested that the Council sign an Agreement to provide services to areas outside the City limits, as they had done in the past. Maxie Turner motioned to accept the Agreement with Howard Stegall seconding. Maxie Turner and Howard Stegall were in favor, with Don Hackney and Raymond Pruitt against. Ronnie Fugate abstained. Mayor Teal voted against and the motion was killed. Don Hackney and Mayor Teal are to go before the County Commissioners Court and request additional funding for the Fire Department.

Consideration was given to the passage of an ordinance limiting the number of vehicles which could be offered for sale in a residential area. Raymond Pruitt motioned to pass the ordinance with Maxie Turner seconding. All were in favor.

After a brief recess the Council retired to executive session.

After executive session, Ronnie Fugate motioned with Howard Stegall seconding to give Michelle Wilson one year's trial basis to promote the First Monday grounds. All were in favor.

The Council unanimously agreed to finish the sewer line project at the industrial site.

The Council unanimously agreed to authorize the advertisement for sale of the old ambulance by sealed bids. The City will accept sealed bids until May 19, 1987.

The City Council met at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall at a regularly scheduled meeting. Mayor Teal presided and all members were present.

The minutes of the March meeting were read by Gerald Turner. After the minutes were corrected, Ronnie Fugate motioned to accept the minutes with Howard Stegall seconding. All were in favor.

The financial statement was reviewed by Don Hackney. Ronnie Fugate motioned to accept the financial statement with Raymond Pruitt seconding the motion. All were in favor.

A petition for repairs to be made to College Street was presented to the Council by citizens who reside on that street. After discussion of the situation, it was decided that members of the Council and concerned citizens would speak to the Commissioner Court in regards to a combined effort on the part of the City and the County to make the necessary repairs.

Howard Stegall motioned that Ronnie Fugate be elected as Mayor Pro-Tem. Jack Etheridge seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Discussion was held concerning making one block of Church Street one way from Buffalo Street. Postmaster Cashion told the Council that the one way street would help relieve congestion caused by patrons of the Post Office. Jack Etheridge motioned that one block of Church Street be made one way (east bound) from Buffalo Street. Ronnie Fugate seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Discussion was held concerning the possible passage of an ordinance prohibiting dogs on the First Monday Grounds. Raymond Pruitt motioned to adopt the ordinance and Don Hackney seconded the motion. Ronnie Fugate voted against, with the remaining Councilmen voting for. The motion carried. The Ordinance will become effective July 1, 1987.

Bids on the sale of the old fire hall and warehouse property were opened and were as follows:

Jack Etheridge motioned that the awarding of the bid be tabled for further study and that an appraisal of the property be obtained first. Don Hackney seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Bank depository bids were opened. Bids were received from The Bank of Van Zandt and First National Bank of Canton. Don Hackney motioned to table the awarding of the bid until a recommendation from the City's CPA can be obtained. Raymond Pruitt seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Discussion was held concerning the request by the Senior Citizens Building to convert one of the present bathrooms into an office for the Site Manager. Don Hackney motioned with Jack Etheridge seconding to proceed with the modifications. All were in favor.

Mr. Duke of E & B Patio spoke to the Council concerning the carport he had proposed to construct at Mrs. Val Goggen's residence on Sides Circle. He requested that consideration be given in regards to the setting aside of the deed restrictions which would prohibit such a structure being built so close to the street. Mr. Duke was informed that as soon as a TML attorney responded to inquiries concerning deed restrictions, that the City would be in touch with him concerning this matter.

Discussion was held concerning the trees around the Courthouse needing trimming. Howard Stegall motioned with Ronnie Fugate seconding to approach the County Judge and Commissioners with the possibility of splitting the cost of the trimming with the City to get dead limbs removed from the trees. All were in favor.

Discussion was held concerning the possibility of building a boat dock at the New City lake and also about general clean up of weeds and such around the City. Ronnie Fugate and Jack Etheridge were appointed to meet with Al Campbell once a week to look at various areas of the City which need to be cleaned up. Gerald Turner and Al Campbell were given the authority to hire extra persons to do the extra clean up.

Don Hackney motioned with Ronnie Fugate seconding to try to obtain water rights for future water needs. All were in favor.

After a brief recess, the Council retired to executive session.

After returning to open session, Howard Stegall motioned with Ronnie Fugate seconding, to raise Nelva Dupree, Martha Liddle, James McClellen and James Hall up one labor grade and to give Al Campbell a 6% salary increase. All were in favor.

She was concerned about an alleged incident that occurred at the City Landfill concerning the disposal of animals. After a lengthy discussion, members of the group that were present, Raymond Pruitt, Don Hackney, and Howard Stegall are to go and speak to Mr. Earl Curry regarding the situation and suggest possible solutions. The Councilmen are to bring back a report to the next regular council meeting.
